Rules & Directives of the competition:

This competition is registered with the Irish dancing commission in Ireland and follows all rules pertaining to their competition rules and code of conduct. These can be found at <u>www.aidainc.com</u> By entering this competition you agree to the following:

- Whilst the Organising Committee take all care in providing correct flooring and facilities, all competitors participate at their own risk.
- Competitors must be pupils of registered teachers with An Comisium Le Rinci Gaelacha
- Dancers who are residents in Australia are required to be registered with AIDA Inc. for the current year.
- No Refunds will be issued under any circumstances.
- Competitor numbers will be made available at the numbers table 60 minutes prior to the scheduled commencement of their section as competitor numbers will not be listed in the program.
- VIDEOING A parent may video their Beginner or Primary child competing on stage from a stipulated area. From Elementary level upwards the videoing of competitors on stage is not permitted except the videoing of set-dances.
- Any form of unauthorised photography of dancers on the stage is prohibited.
- FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY the use of flash photography is not permitted while dancers are performing on stage.
- Should a dancer lose a heel or a complete shoe he/she may stand back, allowing the other dancer, where applicable, to continue dancing uninhibited. In such a case the dancer concerned will be permitted to re-dance as soon as it is deemed practicable by the stage personnel.
- Should a dancer fall on stage the adjudicator will ring the bell thereby stopping the performance of all dancers on stage. They will have the opportunity to re-dance.
- Should in the opinion of the Stage Personnel (in consultation if deemed necessary with medical personnel) a dancer be unfit to re-dance, and if such dancer insists on performing, the dancer concerned will only be permitted to re-dance on completion of a formal declaration which removes the organising committee of any liability.
- No block, en point, stationary or moving be allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the under 12 age group.
- In all competitions for primary level upwards, all heavy dancing ie jig or hornpipe, the lead around must be danced on both the right and left foot.
- Costumes must consist of a full front and back section, i.e. cutaway styles are not acceptable.
- Skirt lengths the minimum skirt length is not more than four inches above knee level. Neck lines must be of collar-bone level or above.
- Appropriate underwear must be worn. Where tights are worn they must be of a denier of not less than 70.
- Any competitor found to be using artificial carriage aids and subsequently refused to remove same, will be subject to disqualification from those particular competitions. Medically prescribed apparatus (proof of which may be required) will be exempt from this ruling.

- New Costume rules for the different grades are as follows:

Appropriate attire* refers to long/short-sleeved blouses/shirts & skirts/trousers, polo tops & skirts/ trousers, body suits & skirts or tunics that conform to the regular costume length rule. Low-cut tops and short tight skirts are not permitted.
