Age as of 1st January 2023 and gradings as of time of entry.

Dancers may compete in both the Premiership AND graded events for their age group. There is no limit on the number of dances entered.

### **RULES**

Competitors must be pupils of Registered Teachers with An Coimisiun Le Rince Gaelacha who are also registered with AIDA Inc and their residing state for the year 2023.

Entries must be submitted by your teacher and received by the official closing date on the supplied entry sheets. Proof of payment of entries also needs to be supplied.

Competitors enter at their own risk regarding injury. Tara Academy does not accept any liability for injuries sustained. Lodgement of an entry will be deemed to be an acceptance of this provision by a dancer/their guardian.

All competitors must be ready to commence their section at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. The Feis organising committee has the right to commence sections up to 30 minutes prior to the advised starting time.

It is the competitor's responsibility to be in the marshalling area when called, otherwise they may miss this section. The Feis organiser reserves the right to amend the order of dances and/or dancers at any time.

Competitors will be required to dance to music supplied which will be sourced from the Feis App. If there is a problem with music, the dancer will be permitted to re-dance.

If a dancer loses a heel or a complete shoe, he/she may stand back allowing the other dancer to continue dancing uninhibited. The dancer will then be allowed to re-dance. Should a dancer bump, slip or fall, they may re-dance at the adjudicators discretion and if no injury has been sustained.

In a Premiership, where a dancer fails to complete his/her performance in any given round, that dancer is to be given zero marks by each adjudicator for that round. The decision of the adjudicator is final.



### RULES CONT.

To receive prizes or awards, competitors must be in full dancing costume including shoes.

In all competitions for Primary level upwards, all heavy dancing i.e Jig & Hornpipe, the Lead Round must be danced on both right & left foot.

No block, en point, stationary or moving is allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the 11 years and under age groups (this includes Treble Reels).

In graded sections, competitors are required to perform correct standard of work as set out in the AIDA Inc Competitions Rules and Regulations. Competitors will be disqualified by adjudicators if incorrect standard of work is performed.

Artificial Carriage Aids – in order to comply with heath and safety measures, all dancers lining up side stage prior to any round at any competition will be required to perform the simple exercise of raising their arms to shoulder level unhindered. If unable to do this by the time of their rotation due to costume stitching or arm attachments, these competitors will not be permitted to perform.

Make up and leg tan will not be permitted for any dancer in Novice, Beginner (Bun) and Primary (Tus) for 11 years and under. For the purposes of this rule the term "make up" includes tinted moisturiser and any artificial tanning products. In all other grades i.e Elementary (Mean 1), Intermediate (Mean) and Open (Ard) the 9 years and under age group are not permitted to wear makeup, including false eye lashes and tanner on face in either solo or teams (Ceili) but are permitted to wear tanning products on legs.

### RULES CONT.

Competitors in Bun Grad & Tus Grad, up to and including the Under 12 age group, may only wear traditional class costumes or long/short-sleeved blouses/shirts & skirts/trousers, polo tops & skirts/trousers, body suits & skirts or tunics that conform to the regular costume length rule. Low-cut tops and short tight skirts are not permitted.

To receive prizes or awards, competitors must be in full dancing costume including shoes.

Costume dress necklines must be of collar-bone level or above, This does not preclude the use of alternative fabrics e.g. lace as an insert. Where lace of chiffon is used as sleeves, the sleeves must start at the shoulder line and end at the cuff. Length of costumes must adhere to the principles of modesty and enable dancers to safely execute their movements and steps.

Adjudicators who determine a costume to be too short or to lack modesty, may ask a competitor to change into black tights (of a denier no less than 70) in order for the dancer to continue in the competition. When wearing body suits with skirts (commonly known as black-out attire) black tights (of a denier no less than 70) must be worn from the age of 14 and above. Appropriate underwear, covering the midriff, must be worn.

In accordance with our obligations under the Protection Policy, dancers are reminded to wear appropriate dress at all times while at the Feis. No changing in the main hall.

Photography and/or video is permitted in Novice sections and Beginner sections only, as per the photography statement below:

Please note that any form of unauthorised photography which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means e.g. mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, cine recorder, commercial film with or without flash enhancement is expressly forbidden in all other levels of competition, i.e. Primary, Intermediate, Elementary and Open competition unless prior permission has been given by the Feis organisers.
