The presentation of our 'Mini Midlands' is for children up to and including Under 6 who have never participated in a graded competition, ie Novice.

This competition is aimed at our smallest children who love their dancing lessons but aren't quite ready for a full 32 bar dance. The children will be dancing to live reel music at the speed 124. Each child will have the opportunity to perform to 16 bars of music on our main stage and will be clapped in time.

Each Mini Midlands dancer will receive a special prize in recognition of their participation.

NB - Mixed team competitions - A mixed team may dance at a Regional Oireachtas with a minimum of one male dancer Please note the following:

- Boys competing in a four hand Ceili Championship may not compete in any eight hand Ceili Championship either in their own age group or an older age group.
- 2019 World medal holders and qualifiers from this year's secondary qualifying must compete at Oireachtas Rince la Na Breataine 2021 to be eligible to compete at the World Championships 2022 unless they can provide certified Doctors Note to the Secretary of Midlands Regional Council in advance of Oireachtas Rince Lar Na Breataine 2021.
- Competitors must dance in numerical order as far as possible. Start numbers will be announced in official programme If a dancer misses their turn they will not be allowed to dance.

- Objections regarding breach of rules should be made in writing by a teacher only. It should be accompanied by a £25 fee and handed to the Regional Council Secretary Jenny Wilson Flower within 1 hour of the competition conclusion to which the objection is applicable. Each objection must be put in writing separately with the appropriate fee. If the objection is upheld the fee(s) will be returned.
- The Midlands Regional Council will not be held liable for the loss or theft of any personal belongings.
- No flash photography, mobile devices, digital cameras, cine filming or camcorders will be allowed whilst dancers
 are performing as per CLRG rule.
- The use of mobile phones in the theatre is prohibited.

1.1. PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

- A minimum number of three Adjudicators must officiate.
- The first age group for a Preliminary Championship is Under 10.
- Where a Preliminary Championship is held separate from an Open Championship, three rounds should be offered, namely; Reel or Slip Jig, Heavy Jig or Hornpipe and any Set Dance.
- Where a Preliminary Championship is combined with an Open Championship, then the result should be taken from eligible dancers' ranking after the first two rounds.
- Where there are separate Preliminary and Open Championships, dancers can compete in both at the discretion of the Feis organiser.
- Where a competitor wins two Preliminary Championships they must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
 - For grading purposes, two wins will be taken as being in any two year rolling period. Where a dancer
 does not win a second Preliminary within two years of winning their first Preliminary Championship,
 then the first win will be deemed as having expired and the dancer starts afresh.
 - Where there are less than 6* in a Preliminary Championship that win will not normally be considered for grading purposes. However, where a dancer wins three Preliminary Championships regardless of the number of competitors in each competition, that dancer must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
- Dances performed in a Preliminary Championships do not count for grading in solo competitions.
- Due to Covid-19 restrictions, and until further notice, please note the following:
 - All dancers*, who are included on the official confirmed list of qualifiers for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne 2022, are not eligible to compete in Preliminary Championships until further notice. *This excludes dancers that auto qualified at their Regional or National Oireachtas due to lack of numbers.
- Dancers placing 1st-3rd in an Open Championship with up to 20* competitors or 1st-5th in an Open Championship with more than 20* Competitors cannot compete in a Preliminary Championship for a period of 12 month.
- Implementation date 1st January 2021.
- 1.2. The Midland region allows dancers to participate in any 1 round of preliminary champs as a separate solo round these dancers should not be included in the numbers indicated above with *.

Recognition as a Qualifying event for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne 2022 An event will not be recognised as such where:

(a) is not held by December 31st, 2021, unless written permission is granted by An Coimisiun, OR

(b) attendance at the Oireachtas is restricted due to Covid 19 travel restrictions imposed by the local or national Health Authority of the area resulting in all dancers in a Region being unable to attend.

Exemption from section(b) passed at CLRG meeting September, 2021:

Any Oireachtas experiencing government mandates, recommendations against travel, or excessive quarantining requirements in any particular area of the region, will be allowed to continue as a qualifying event. Dancers impacted will retain their qualification without being required to participate. This is in effect due to Covid for the 2021 primary qualifying events only
