# **Lodgement of Entries - Please Read Carefully**

- 1. The website for lodgement of entries is https://www.instepfm.com. The website provides clear instructions on how to complete the lodgement process.
- 2. Download Entry Pack and email to des@instepfm.com or desilke@instepfm.com.
- 3. An email confirming all entries submitted and the total fee payable will be sent to the teacher.
- 4. Payment must be received 7th November 2022.
- 5. Payment can be made by BACS transfer to the account details as stated above.
- 6. Entries received after the final date of 7th November 2022 will be treated as late and not accepted.
- 7. Members need to be aware that once entries are 'SUBMITTED' they need to pay the amount on the confirmation email. If the amount on the confirmation email is not fully paid entries will not be accepted.
- It is the responsibility of the teacher to ensure that the entry as submitted is correct. When the confirmation email is received, names and dates of birth must be carefully checked. Spellings etc. as submitted by the teacher will be that which appears in the official programme.
- 9. Incomplete entries will not be accepted.
- 10. All dancers' names for both solo and ceili entries must be submitted by the closing date.
- 11. No refunds will be made for any entry money received.
- 12. PLEASE ENSURE THAT YOUR ENTRY CLEARLY DETAILS AND IDENTIFIES EACH PUPIL WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR ENTRY INTO THE PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIP BY MARKING THE APPROPRIATE COLUMN ON THE ENTRY FORM

## **Competition Rules**

- 1. A dancer's age group will be determined as from 1st January 2022.
- 2. Entries will only be accepted from dancing teachers registered with An Coimisiún Le Rinci Gaelacha for the year 2022/2023. Only dancers who reside in the Southern England Region are eligible to enter and qualify for the 2023 World Championships, through this Regional Oireachtas.
- 3. The adjudicators' decision is final. Only members of the Southern England Regional Council and those officially assisting them in the running of the championships may approach the adjudicators during competitions.
- 4. Complaints will only be accepted from registered teachers, in writing, and must be accompanied by a fee of £25.00, which may be refunded if the Southern England Regional Council upholds said objection.
- 5. Teachers are advised that all details required on the entry forms must be completed. Entryforms received in contravention of this rule will be returned.
- 6. All competitors must be ready to dance 30 minutes prior to the published time. They must also report to the stage stewards promptly and dance in the prescribed order. Failure to report in time to dance in order will lead to disqualification. Competitors are strongly advised to check the timetable for last-minute changes to times or halls, both leading up to the event and on the day of competition.
- 7. In all rounds, the minimum speeds of music as laid down by An Coimisiún will apply.
- 8. Any competitors found to be using artificial carriage aids will be requested to remove same. In the case of refusal, disqualfication will follow. In the case of medical apparatus, this will be permitted upon the production of a letter from a medical practitioner or other documentary evidence in support, to prove authenticity and the requirement for the aid to be used or worn.
- 9. Any form of unauthorised photography which has the capability of capturing a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means, e.g. mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, cine recorder, commercial film, with or without flash enhancement, is expressly forbidden during compet itions. Photographs taken at awards ceremonies are permitted. However, these must be for your own use, and not for public display purposes unless permission has been obtained
- 10. The rules of An Coimisiún Le Rinci Gaelacha as regards standards of dress must be adhered to in public areas of the venue; discretion must be exerted when dancers are changing for competitions. Changing areas will be provided.
- 11. Dancers taking part in results ceremonies will not be permitted to go onto stage to receive any award unless in full costume and wearing black dance shoes.
- 12. All dancers deserve the same respect and ovation on completion of their performance. Excessive and unique verbal celebrations will not be tolerated on completion of a performance.
- 13. All cups and shields are perpetual awards. These are the responsibility of the holder for the relevant year, who is responsible for loss and any damage not previously reported. Such cups and shields must be returned in good time for the corresponding competitions this year.



- 14. Where a dancer has entered the Oireachtas, prior to its commencement, and is unable to compete due to illness or injury, and is a World Medal Holder from 2022 World Championships, a medical certificate may be presented to the Oireachtas Secretary for submission to An Coimisiun, asking for the requirement to participate at the Regional Oireachtas by this dancer, to be waived due to this situation. The certificate must be presented no later than 7 days from the end of the Oireachtas.
- 15. The Southern England Regional Council have made every effort to ensure that the stages constructed for the championships are of the correct specification in design and structure, considering health and safety issues. All stages are covered with Harlequin flooring. By entering the championships, competitors accept this statement, and neither the Centre Management nor the Southern England Regional Council can be held liable for any incident or event which could not be reasonably foreseen.

#### Costume related rules

- 1. An Coimisiun has ruled that from 1st January of each year, that no block, en pointe, stationary or moving be allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the under 12 age group Worldwide. The Under 12 Age Group will be allowed to Toe Walk from 1st September.
- 2. Make-up Rules (4.5 in CLRG Rule Book) 4.5.2 Make-up (including false eyelashes) is not permitted for dancers, in either solo or team competitions, up to and including the Under 10 age group (POINT OF CLARIFICATION) For the purposes of this rule the term "Make-up" includes tinted moisturiser and any artificial tanning products. An Coimisiún hopes that teachers and parents will interpret and apply this rule in the spirit in which it is intended
- 3. Length of costume must adhere to principles of modesty and enable dancers to safely execute their movements and steps. Adjudicators who determine a costume to be too short or to lack modestly may ask a competitor to wear black tights (of a denier not less than 70 percent) in order to continue in the competition. For competitions adjudicated by a panel of more than one adjudicator, all adjudicators on the panel must agree to ask the dancer to wear tights.

Appropriate undergarments covering the midriff must be worn. Undergarments must provide full coverage. Dancers wearing undergarments that do not cover the areas of the body as in the illustrated example will be asked to put on black tights of a denier of not less than 70%. This is monitored by the adjudicator. For competitions adjudicated by a panel of more than one adjudicator all adjudicator on the panel must agree to ask the dancer to put on tights.

#### Performance related rules

- 1. In all heavy dances the lead-round must be danced on both right and left feet.
- 2. Competitors will dance the following:
  - a. U6 & U7 48 bars in reel and 40 bars in single jig/light/heavy jig
  - b. U8 & U9 48 bars in reel and 40 bars in heavy jig.
  - c. U10 Senior 48 bars in the reel and heavy Jig, 40 bars in the slip jig and hornpipe
  - d. Under 10 Boys & Girls Recall dancers must dance jig set only in line with An Coimisiún ruling
- 3. Competitors will dance in rounds 1 & 2 after an 8-bar introduction. Competitors beginning to dance before or after the stipulated 8 bar introduction will automatically receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators for that round.
- 4. Should a competitor reach the final round, they will be required to submit the name and metronomic speed of their open set dance nominated by them to the stage steward.
- 5. In the open set dance round a competitor may choose his/her starting position.
- 6. The onus of ensuring that the stage steward is informed of the correct name and metronomic speed of the nominated open set dance will rest with the competitor.
- 7. An incorrect metronomic speed submitted for an open set dance can only be changed prior to the commencement of the playing of the relevant set dance for that competitor.
- 8. Introductions to open set dances will be played only once and no alteration in that speed of music will be permitted.
- 9. Should a competitor commence dancing to an incorrect metronomic speed submitted to the stage steward then that competitor must continue to dance at that speed as no further opportunity of tempo change will be afforded.
- 10. Competitors beginning to dance before or after the stipulated set dance introduction will automatically receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators for that round.
- 11. If a competitor fails to complete the Double Jig or Hornpipe round of a championship, they will receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators for that round. As a courtesy, they will be allowed todance the equivalent light shoe round and whilst they will receive marks from each adjudicator they will automatically receive ZERO points and will not be allowed to progress further in the Solo Championship.
- 12. If a competitor fails to complete the Reel or Slip Jig round of a championship, they will receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators for that round and will not be allowed to progress any further in the Solo Championship.
- 13. A competitor who fails to complete the open set dance round will receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators for that round and cannot appear in a medal winning position.

- 14. Definition of complete means that all bars as outlined in the syllabus are danced without any stops.
- 15. Choreographed pauses in steps are permitted.
- 16. In the event of a mishap on stage, e.g. a heel or shoe coming off, the dancer should retire to the back of the stage and remain there, allowing the other dancer(s) to continue with their performance. If a dancer fails to comply with this direction and leaves the stage, then he/she will be deemed to have failed to complete the round and will be eliminated from the championship.
- 17. Should a dancer fall, and the stage situation be that he/she inhibits the performance or safety of other dancers on stage, the bell will be rung, and the group will be permitted to dance again. Should the fall happen in the last 16 bars of the dance then the dancer/s will be required to re dance the last 16 bars only.
- 18. If a competitor sustains injury or illness during a competition, and the organisers have reason to believe that such an illness or injury could be exacerbated by continued participation, he/she will be advised to retire from the competition. If this advice is ignored, then prior to continuation, the dancer (or in the case of a child or young person (5 to 17 years) an appropriate adult) will be required to sign a disclaimer form, which will be retained in the event of a possible future enquiry.

#### PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIPS RULE

THERE WILL BE A PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIP RUN IN CONJUNCTION WITH EACH GIRLS CHAMPIONSHIP FROM UNDER 10 UPWARDS OF THE OIREACHTAS. THIS WILL APPLY TO THOSE DANCERS WHO ARE ELIGIBLE <u>AND HAVE BEEN ENTERED</u> TO BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATON WHEN CALCULATING THE RESULT. N.B. THIS WILL BE BASED ON THE 1<sup>ST</sup> 2 ROUNDS OF THE COMPETITION AND ENTRY IS SUBJECT TO THE SOUTHERN ENGLAND OIREACHTAS RULE FOR PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIPS

#### **ELIGIBILITY**:

- 1. Preliminary Championships A minimum number of three Adjudicators must officiate.
- 2. The first age group for a Preliminary Championship is Under 10.
- 3. Where a Preliminary Championship is held separate from an Open Championship, three rounds should be offered, namely, Reel or Slip Jig, Heavy Jig or Hornpipe and any Set Dance.
- 4. Where a Preliminary Championship is combined with an Open Championship, then the result should be taken from eligible dancers' ranking after the first two rounds.
- 5. Where there are separate Preliminary and Open Championships, dancers can compete in both at the discretion of the Feis organiser.
- 6. Where a competitor wins two Preliminary Championships, they must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
- 7. For grading purposes, two wins will be taken as being in any two-year rolling period. Where a dancer does not win a second Preliminary within two years of winning their first Preliminary Championship, then the first win will be deemed as having expired and the dancer starts afresh.
- 8. Where there are less than 6 in a Preliminary Championship that win will not normally be considered for grading purposes. However, where a dancer wins three Preliminary Championships regardless of the number of competitors in each competition, that dancer must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
- 9. Dances performed in a Preliminary Championships do not count for grading in solo competitions.
- 10. Competitors that qualify for and compete in Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne in the previous 12 months cannot compete in a Preliminary Championship except where the dancer auto qualified at their Regional or National Oireachtas due to lack of numbers.
- 11. Dancers placing 1st-3rd in an Open Championship with up to 20 competitors or 1st-5th in an Open Championship with more than 20 Competitors cannot compete in a Preliminary Championship for a period of 12 month

Dancers who wish to be considered in the Preliminary Championship result, must complete the appropriate entry section on the Oireachtas entry system for their age group. Failure to do so at entry, will mean they will not be considered when calculating the preliminary result. Teachers are asked to check all entries submitted, before the event, to ensure the correct information on preliminary entry is submitted.

#### THERE WILL NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED ON THE DAY TO THE PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIPS.

In the event of a dispute not covered by any of the rules of these championship, reference will be made to the Rules of An Coimisiún, appertaining to the issue or matter in dispute.
