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#### **RULES OF THE FLEADH**

The Spring Fleadh, though privately run is conducted under the rules and regulations of the Australian Irish Dancing Association Incorporated, the Australian Irish Dancing Association (SA,NT&TAS) Branch and the Irish Dancing Commission. The following rules should be read in light of the AIDA Mission statement, the objective of which is to encourage good sportsmanship in a healthy, positive and fair spirited environment. This objective should be upheld by ALL teachers, dancers, parents and spectators at all events.

- 1. Competitors must be pupils of Registered Teachers with An Coimisiun Le Rinci Gaelacha who are also registered with AIDA SA Inc and AIDA Inc for the year 2022.
- 2. Competitors must be registered with AIDA SA, NT & TAS Inc for 2022.
- 3. No late entries will be accepted.
- 4. There must be a minimum of three (3) competitors to make up an event. Entry fees will be refunded if insufficient numbers are received. This will be at the organiser's discretion.
- 5. All sections up to and including Under 12 will dance 3 at a time.
- 6. All competitors must be ready to commence their section at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. The Feis organizing committee has the right to commence sections up to 30 minutes prior to the advertised start time.
- 7. All competitors must be in the marshalling area prior to the commencement of their sections otherwise they will be disqualified.
- 8. The organisers reserve the right to amend the order of the program at any time.
- 9. In the case of a tie, there will be no dance off. Competitors in the next position will move back a place.
- 10. Competitors will be required to dance to music supplied by the organizers except in the case of choreography reels in couples.
- 11. If there is a problem with music, either manual or recorded, the dancer will be permitted to re-dance.
- 12. If a dancer loses a heel or a complete shoe, he/she may stand back allowing the other dancer to continue dancing uninhibited. Such a dancer will then be allowed to re-dance.
- 13. Should a dancer bump, slip or fall, they may re-dance at the adjudicator's discretion.
- 14. No block, en point, stationary or moving is allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the 11 years and under age groups.
- 15. If a dancer falls the adjudicator **must** ring the bell. The dancer will be permitted to re-dance at the adjudicator's discretion.
- 16. In graded sections, competitors are required to perform correct standard of work as set out in the AIDA Inc Competitions Rules and Regulations. Competitors will be disqualified by adjudicators if incorrect standard of work is performed.
- 17. Lead Round heavy dancing. In all competitions all heavy dances i.e. Jig and Hornpipe, the Lead Round must be danced on both right and left foot. Where a dancer is required to perform a step on the right foot and left foot, all movements in the first 8 bars of footwork must be replicated on the opposite foot in the second 8 bars.
- 18. Make-Up and Fake Tanning will **not** be permitted for any Dancer in Beginner or Primary for 10 & under age groups.
- 19. Dancers competing in Beginner Grade may only wear team costume. If a team costume is not available, girls may wear skirt and top/dress with no sleeveless tops permitted, and boys may wear shorts / trousers / kilt and shirt and tie. Solo costumes and wigs are not permitted in Beginners. Dancers competing in the Beginners sections must abide by the Beginner costume rule.
- 20. Costume dress necklines must be of collar-bone level or above. This does not preclude the use of alternative fabrics eq lace as an insert
- 21. Where chiffon or lace material is used as sleeves, the sleeves must start at the shoulder line and end at the cuff.
- 22. Appropriate underwear must be worn. Where tights are worn they must be of a denier not less than 70.
- 23. The use of artificial arm aids are not permitted
- 24. In accordance with our obligations under the Child Protection policy, dancers are reminded to wear appropriate dress at all times whilst at the Feis (especially in the auditorium area).
- 25. Photography and/or video is permitted in Novice sections and Beginner sections only. Please note that any form of unauthorised photography which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means eg mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, cinerecorder, commercial film with or without flash enhancement is expressly forbidden in all other levels of competition, i.e. Primary, Intermediate, Elementary and Open competition unless prior permission has been given by the Feis organizers.
- 26. The organisers will not enter into any correspondence with parents or non-parents concerning the organization and procedure at a Feis unless these matters are put in writing and presented at an AIDA Meeting
- 27. Lodgment of an entry shall be taken to signify that the Teacher, Parent and Pupils concerned accept these rules in full and agree to strictly abide by them.
