Welcome to our Feis

We are delighted to invite you all to Feis McCarron 2023. For this year, we have secured a brand-new venue in Birmingham offering outstanding facilities. We are hosting a new competition: The Gary Healy Memorial Points Cup, and we will be offering the hospitality, standard of competition and coverage of competition results on social media that you would come to expect of Feis McCarron. There will be catering facilities provided by the school venue, offering hot and cold food during the weekend. Our thanks to all sponsors of awards and to all others that have contributed to the preparation and running of the Feis.

Gary Healy Memorial Cup: Earlier this year we were saddened of the sudden loss of our former dancer Gary Healy. He was a talented dancer winning many titles over the years. He was also a talented teacher contributing to the success of many dancers and guiding them to World Championship titles. On retirement from his competitive and professional dancing in Riverdance, he led a successful career as an attorney. This competition is in memory of Gary and all he achieved in his short life. Over the duration of the feis, points will be awarded for all 1st 2nd and 3rd places in all grades and championships in all dances. One point will also be awarded for every McCarron All-Star competitor. The school with the most points at the end of the feis will be awarded the perpetual Gary Healy Memorial Cup.

McCarron All Stars: This will be aimed at those youngest dances who love Irish dancing but are not quite ready for graded competition. We want to make this a fun and a memorable experience for all our newest Irish dancers so each child will perform 16 bars of light dance music, they will be introduced to our adjudicators and will be counted in to know when to start in the music. The competition is open to dancers who are aged **under 6** and have NOT previously danced in any grade (Novice, Primary, Intermediate or Open) competitions at a feis. The entry fee is £5.50 per child and each dancer will be awarded with a prize to mark their participation.

A panel of 3 adjudicators will judge all Open & Preliminary Championships.

All grade solo competition winners (1st – 3rd) will be awarded trophies. We will be awarding 1st-5th sashes in both Preliminary and Open Championship competitions.

Rules as of July 2021

These rules should be read in conjunction with rules laid out by An Coimisiún Le Rincí Galeacha.

1 GENERAL

- 1.1 The adjudicator's decision is final.
- 1.2 Committee members only may approach adjudicators.
- 1.3 Any protest against breach of rules must be made in writing to the feis organiser within one hour of the conclusion of a competition, with a fee of £10.00. Should the objection be upheld, the fee will be refunded.
- 1.4 Entries will only be accepted from schools registered with An Coimisiún.
- 1.5 Lodgement of entries at a feis implies that you accept the rules relating to the feis in their entirety as laid down by the An Coimisiún le Rincí Gaelacha & Midland Regional Council.

2 AGE GROUPS

- 2.1 Age to be taken from 1st January of the current year. Where a competitor's birthday falls on 1st January, he/she shall, be regarded as under the age attained on that day.
- 2.2 Competitors must dance in their own age group for solo competitions except where there is no provision for that dance in that age group

3 GRADES

- 3.1 At any one Feis, a Novice and Primary Dancer may only dance each Solo Dance in ONE grade.
 - 3.1.1 Exception - Dancers ARE permitted to dance in both Novice Reel and Primary Reel competitions.
- 3.2 **Novice** – Confined to competitors who have not progressed out of Novice grade (including Trophy Competitions) for that particular dance in any age group. (New Costume Rule see COSTUME & MAKE-UP Rule 6.2).
- 3.3 **Primary** - Confined to competitors who have not progressed out of Primary grade (including Trophy Competitions) for that particular dance in any age group.
- 3.4 **Intermediate** – confined to competitors who have not progressed out of Intermediate grade (including Trophy Competitions) for that particular dance in their present age group.
- 3.5 **Open** – Open to all dancers.
- 3.6 All grade competitions are open to all regions.
- 3.7 In a trophy competition, a dancer must have performed their choice of dance in the solo competition
- 3.8 Grade Progression is as follows:

4 PRELIMINARY/OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS AND PREMIER COMPETITIONS:

- 4.1 Championship/Premier Competitions - Only Intermediate and Open dancers are eligible to compete (except under 6 and 7 – see below).
- 4.2 Under 6s & under 7s Championships/Premier must dance Reel & Light Jig/Hop Jig. A recall is at the discretion of the feis organisers. All grades are allowed to compete.
- 4.3 Under 8s and Under 9s must dance Reel and Heavy Jig. A recall is at the discretion of the feis organisers.
 - 4.3.1 Dancers no longer have to dance in the grade competitions to be eligible to compete in the U6, 7, 8 and 9 championships but ALL DANCES MUST BE OFFERED IN THE OPEN GRADE FOR THESE AGE GROUPS.
- 4.4 Under 10 and up. All dancers must be given a choice of Reel or Slip Jig and Jig or Hornpipe and recall set dance.
- 4.5 Subsidiary solos may be run at the discretion of the feis organisers.
- 4.6 If a minimum number is stated for ANY championship to be held, then this must be consistent for ALL championship competitions. E.g., if you decide on a minimum number of 5 in order to run a separate boys or preliminary championship then this must be consistent with the number required to run any championship. This may well be prevalent in the younger age groups where numbers can be low. For example: if you have this rule on your syllabus and you only have 4 entries for Under 6 – you should not run the championship.
- 4.7 PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIP RULES
 - 4.7.1 A minimum number of three Adjudicators must officiate.
 - 4.7.2 The first age group for a Preliminary Championship is Under 10.
 - 4.7.3 Where a Preliminary Championship is held separate from an Open Championship, three rounds should be offered, namely Reel or Slip Jig, Heavy Jig or Hornpipe and any Set Dance.
 - 4.7.4 Where a Preliminary Championship is combined with an Open Championship, then the result should be taken from eligible dancers' ranking after the first two rounds.
 - 4.7.5 Where there are separate Preliminary and Open Championships, dancers can compete in both at the discretion of the Feis organiser.
 - 4.7.6 Where a competitor wins two Preliminary Championships, they must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
 - 4.7.6.1 For grading purposes, two wins will be taken as being in any two-year rolling period. Where a dancer does not win a second Preliminary within two years of winning their first Preliminary Championship, then the first win will be deemed as having expired and the dancer starts afresh.
 - 4.7.6.2 Where there are less than 6* in a Preliminary Championship, that win will not normally be considered for grading purposes. However, where a dancer wins three Preliminary Championships regardless of the number of competitors in each competition, that dancer must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
 - 4.7.7 Dances performed in a Preliminary Championships do not count for grading in solo competitions.
 - 4.7.8 Dancers placing 1st-3rd in an Open Championship with up to 20* competitors or 1st-5th in an Open Championship with more than 20* Competitors cannot compete in a Preliminary Championship for a period of 12 month.

Implementation date 1st January 2021.
- 4.8 The Midland region allows dancers to participate in any 1 round of preliminary champs as a separate solo round – these dancers should not be included in the numbers indicated above with *.

5 DANCE MOVEMENTS

- 5.1 In Novice Grades only basic steps should be performed i.e., no intricate movements.
- 5.2 Rules appertaining to Dance movements such as toe movements, metronomic speeds as laid out by An Coimisiún apply.
- 5.3 Metronomic Speeds – **Please note new speeds (Red and highlighted) Implemented from Jan 2022.**

6 COSTUME & MAKE-UP

- 6.1 All costume and make-up rules as set out in CLRG rules must be adhered to EXCEPT see * in 6.2.
- 6.2 All competitors in all age groups in Novice & Primary, may only wear traditional class customers or long / short sleeve blouses and skirts / trousers, polo tops and skirts / trousers, body suits and skirts or tunics that conform to the regular costume length rule. Low-cut tops and short tight skirts are not permitted. **(As of the January 2022 no solo costumes are allowed in Novice/Primary competitions)**
- 6.3 Adjudicators who determine a costume to be too short or to lack modesty, may use the Costume Infraction (Tick Box) Program, in order to flag the dancer and ensure the teacher is notified. As the Costume Infraction Program is used for ALL costume violations, adjudicators wishing to specify length as the infraction can write the letter 'L' in the Tick Box column.
- 6.4 Under no circumstances should dancers walk around any dancing venue in their underwear. Neither should dancers (regardless of age) change in to, or out of costume in the main dancing hall, if at all possible. At all times, dancers should be properly attired.
- 6.5 Make-up, including false eyelashes and tan on the face, is not permitted for any dancer in solo or team competition, up to and including the under 10 age group, nor in the first two grades, up to and including the under 12 age group. Leg tan is NOT part of this rule.

7 FIGURE AND CÉILÍ

- 7.1 In Figure and Céilí competitions - rules regarding age and re-dancing, as laid out by An Coimisiún, apply.
- 7.2 Figure Championship in the U7's year group may be a 6-hand dance, 8 hand Céilí or Figure Dance of 6 or more.
- 7.3 Céilí 8 Hand competitions - Any 8 Hand may be performed in accordance with Ár Rincí Fóirne.
- 7.4 Mixed Céilí – A mixed team must consist of at least 2 boys or 2 girls.

8 MEDIA POLICY

- 8.1 Any form of unauthorised photography, which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means e.g., mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, commercial film, with or without enhancement, is expressly forbidden during competitions.
- 8.2 All photographs of competitors, competitions and presentations may only be taken for personal use. They may not be redistributed, sold, lent or passed on to third parties. They may also not be used for commercial purposes or used in any publication or website (all forms of social media – Facebook, Twitter, Instagram) without the express written permission of the organisers and the parents or guardians of dancers included therein.
- 8.3 Feis organisers may appoint an official photographer for the event, who will take photographs of competitors, competitions and presentations. Such photographs may be subsequently used for marketing and promotional purposes.
- 8.4 **Should any dancer or dancer's parent or guardian wish to be excluded from any of these photographs, then the Feis Organiser should be informed in writing prior to the event commencing.**

9 CARRIAGE AIDS

- 9.1 Any competitor found to be using artificial carriage aids and subsequently refuses to remove same, will be subject to disqualification from that particular competition. Medically prescribed apparatus (proof of which may be required) will be exempt from this ruling.
- 9.2 Any competitor wearing their shoes on the wrong feet will be treated in the same manner as if using carriage aids and be subject to disqualification from that particular competition.
- 9.3 In order to comply with health and safety measures, all dancers lining up side-stage prior to any round of a competition, will be required to perform the simple exercise of raising arms to shoulder level unhindered. If unable to do this due to costume stitching or arm attachments by the time of their rotation, these dancers will not be permitted to perform.

10 ORDER OF DANCING, CONDUCT, MISHAPS ETC.

- 10.1 Should a dancer lose a heel or a complete shoe or have an open lace he/she may stand back – allowing the other dancer(s), where applicable, to continue dancing uninhibited. In such a case, the dancer concerned will be permitted to re-dance as soon as it is deemed practicable by the stage steward.
- 10.2 Should a dancer fall on stage, whether in solos or in teams, the adjudicator MUST ring the bell to stop the performance of the dancer(s). Dancers so affected will be permitted to re-dance and will be marked then at the discretion of each individual adjudicator. If a dancer falls during the last 8 bars of any performance, then he/she would only be required to dance the last 16 bars of that dance.
- 10.3 Should a dancer slip, bump into another dancer or have a costume malfunction whether in solos or in teams, the bell will be rung at the discretion of the adjudicators to stop the performance of the dancer(s). Dancers so affected will be permitted to re-dance and will be marked then at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
- 10.4 Where a dancer fails to complete his/her performance in any given round, that dancer will automatically receive ZERO marks from all adjudicators for that round.
- 10.5 Competitors beginning to dance before or after the stipulated set dance introduction will automatically receive ZERO marks from all adjudicators for that round.
- 10.6 A competitor must not walk off the stage during a performance unless instructed to do so by an adjudicator. A dancer who dismisses themselves from the stage without the permission of an adjudicator will not be marked for that particular dance.

Programme of Competitions

Championships

All Championships will be run as mixed competitions from U10. Also included in the price, is a separate solo result for each of the first 2 rounds of the Championship. These results will be taken, one from each of the three adjudicators on the panel.

Preliminary single round

Dancers who are ineligible to dance in the Intermediate grade for Reel, Slip jig, Heavy Jig or Hornpipe may enter for just one round of the Preliminary Championship i.e., Light or Heavy (£5.50). This is particularly pertinent for younger/new dancers who may have gained a first place in the Intermediate grade but are not quite ready for full Preliminary Championship level. Separate solo results are awarded in the first two rounds.

Alongside our usual schedule of competitions we will be running the following two competitions:

Gary Healy Memorial Cup

This competition is in memory of Gary and all he achieved in his short life. Over the duration of the feis, points will be awarded for all 1st 2nd and 3rd places in all grades and championships in all dances. One point will also be awarded for every McCarron All-Star competitor. The school with the most points at the end of the feis will be awarded the perpetual Gary Healy Memorial Cup.

McCarron All Stars

This will be aimed at those youngest dances who love Irish dancing but are not quite ready for graded competition. We want to make this a fun and a memorable experience for all our newest Irish dancers so each child will perform 16 bars of light dance music, they will be introduced to our adjudicators and will be counted in to know when to start in the music.
