EILIGIBLTY:

TERMS & CONDITIONS

Our competition is run under TIDANZ and An Coimisiún Le Rincí Gaelacha:

- 1. Competitors must be pupils of Registered Teachers with An Coimisiún Le Rincí Gaelacha.
- 2. Entries must be submitted on the official entry form and fees paid by the due date.
- 3. All competitors must be ready to commence their section at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. The Feis organising committee has the right to commence sections up to 30 minutes prior to the advertised start time.
- 4. It is competitor's responsibility to be in the marshalling area when called, otherwise they will miss their section.
- 5. The organisers reserve the right to amend the order of dances at any time.
- 6. In the case of a tie, there will be no dance off. Competitors in the next position will move back a place.
- 7. Competitors will be required to dance to music supplied by the organisers. Teachers may be required to supply their own music for set dances.
- 8. If there is a problem with music, either manual or recorded, the dancer will be permitted to redance.

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- 9. If a dancer loses a heel or a complete shoe, he/she may stand back allowing the other dancer to continue dancing uninhibited. Such a dancer will then be allowed to re-dance.
- 10. Should a dancer bump, slip or fall, they may re-dance at the adjudicator's discretion.
- 11. No block, en-point, stationary or moving is allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the 11 years and under age groups.
- 12. If a dancer falls the adjudicator must ring the bell. The dancer will be permitted to re-dance at the adjudicator's discretion.
- 13. Where a dancer fails to complete his/her performance in any given round, in a Premiership, that dancer is to be given zero marks by each adjudicator for that round.
- 14. Lead Round / heavy dancing. In all levels of competitions in all heavy dancing i.e. Jig and Hornpipe, the Lead Round must be danced on both right and left foot.
- 15. Make-Up and Fake Tanning will not be permitted for any Dancer in Beginner or Novice age group with exemption of the Adult Beginners 18 years and over. Make-up is not permitted for any dancers in sections Under 10 years.
- 16. Dancers competing in novice Grade may only wear Team costume. Girls may wear a skirt and top with no sleeveless tops permitted. Solo costumes are not permitted in Novice. Boys may wear their team costume, shorts/ trousers / kilt and shirt.
- 17. The decision of the adjudicator is final.
- 18. To receive prizes or awards, competitors must be in full dancing costume including shoes.
- 19. Any form of unauthorised photography which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means e.g. mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, cinerecorder, commercial film with or without flash enhancement is expressly forbidden in competition unless prior permission has been given by the Feis organisers. Except for dancers in the Novice and sections.
- 20.In accordance with our obligations under the Protection policy, dancers are reminded to wear appropriate dress at all times whilst at the Feis (especially in the auditorium area). NB. This means for that shorts / skirt must be worn over leotards at all times.
- 21. The use of artificial arm aids is not permitted.
- 22. Competitors enter at their own risk regarding injury. Doyle Academy, Leeann and Paula Doyle along with CESDAIDI will not accept any liability for injuries sustained. Lodgement of an entry will be deemed to be an acceptance of this provision by a dancer.
- 23. Lodgement of an entry shall be taken to signify that the Teacher, Parent and Pupils concerned accept these rules in full and agree to strictly abide by them.
