PREVIEW COMPETITIONS

- FRIDAY PREVIEW Competitions on Friday only feis competitions are offered to Beginner through Preliminary Championship.
- These PREVIEW competitions are a second chance to qualify. These are full fledge competitions that will be adjudicated just like the Saturday regular competitions. Available competitions are highlighted in GREEN.
- All available PREVIEW competitions are highlighted in GREEN below, and will all end with the letter "P"
- PREVIEW competitions are exactly the same as the regular feis competitions and have the same value

 so winning in a PREVIEW competition is the same as winning at a regular feis competition.
- To compete in PREVIEW competition, you will need to select the competitions you wish to compete in, and make sure to PAY for them. Just registering for the feis does not include entry into the PREVIEW competitions.
- You can register for these online (look for the SPECIALS section down the registration screen on www.QuickFeis.com), or you will also be able to register on Friday the day of the PREVIEWS – but you will be charged a late fee! So avoid the late fee and register online!
- PREVIEW competitions will be split and or combined with adjacent age groups just like regular competitions are.
- PREVIEW competitions will be awarded a prize just like the regular competitions are.
- PREVIEW competition fees will not be included in the family max calculation.

Winners of PREVIEW competitions will be allowed to CHANGE their SATURDAY registration for FREE.

DAY OF FEIS PROCESSES

- Registration fees will not be transferred from Friday to Saturday or from Saturday to Friday under any circumstances
- New registrations will be taken in person at the feis provided the feis has not capped in that group.
- NEW REGISTRATIONS and CHANGES can be made anytime during the day – BUT MUST BE MADE AT LEAST ONE HOUR BEFORE the competition(s) being entered in. So unless your dancer is dancing first thing in the day, there is no need to come before the feis.
- NEW REGISTRATION procedure:
 - o Find the TABULATION desk
 - Fill out a NEW REGISTRATION card for each new dancer – even if you registered online and did not pay, your registration was dropped and you will need to fill out this card.
 - Pay for your registration with cash or credit card.
 Please note that you will be charged the \$50 late fee per dancer IN ADDITION to all the regular fees, and the family max will NOT be applied.
 - You will be given a dancer card that will look just like all the other dancer cards.
- Registration CHANGE procedure:
 - Pick up your dancer card from REGISTRATION
 - Bring your card to the TABULATION desk
 - Your fees can be paid with cash or credit card
 - CHANGE Fee is PER dancer
 - Includes switching any number of competitions
 - Any additional competition will be charged the REGULAR price <u>per competition</u>, in addition to the CHANGE fee (per dancer)
- After you made a NEW REGISTRATION or a CHANGE, please show your dancer card to the stage manager (the person at each stage that checks the dancers in before they dance), and let them know you registered that day. They will write you in their book and when it is time for your dancer to dance, they will be already written in, and there will be no issue

NEW REGISTRATION PROCESS: Only ONE team member needs to register and will be charged the fee for the entire team. Only the team member who registers will have their dancer number in the stage book and will be considered the "team captain" for whom scores will be given. The "team captain" MUST wear the dancer number that was used to register the team. It is not necessary to notify the Feis nor QuickFeis who the other team members will be.

The team age group is determined by the OLDEST dancer on their team. All ADULT team members are usually 18 or older.

MID-ATLANTIC REGIONAL DANCING COMPETITION RULES

DANCING COMPETITION RULES

Adopted By The North American Feis Commissi on, 2008

EFFECTIVE JANUARY .1, 2008

- In the case of all solo and team competitions in all grades, the age
 of a competitor on 1st January of the year in which the competition
 is held will determined at the time of entry. For the purposes of this
 Rule a competitor whose birthday occurs on January 1st shall be
 deemed to be under the age atained on that date.
- Competitions are open to all but those holding a TMRF, TCRG, or ADCRG designation. All dancers must be pupils of a person currently registered with An Coimisiun as a Dancing Teacher of any category.
- 3. A competitor may be disqualified for any of the following reasons:
 - a. Conduct unbecoming a lady or gentleman.
 - b. Failure to report on time to compete.
 (Penalty: disqualification from said event)
 - c. Falsification of age or other important facts i.e., teaching, award winning, competing under another competitor's name or number, etc.

Penalty for a) or c): Competitor will be disqualified from the Feis at which the occurrence happened and from all NAFC - registered Feiseanna for a period of one year beginning at the date of the occurrence.

- 4. Competitions may be closed if there are no competitors at the assigned stage ready to compete when the competition is scheduled or announced. May not pertain to a situation where competitors are involved in stage conflicts.
- Solo competitors in First Feis (if offered), Beginner, Advanced Beginner, Novice or Open (Prizewinner) competitions:
 - a. Must compete in their own age group.
 - b. Must be prepared to perform two steps in each event.
 - c. Cannot change competition on the day of the Feis.
- 6. Steel taps or "bubble" heels on dancing shoes, display of awards, wearing of shorts or other unconventional dress is prohibited. Authentic Gaelic dress is desired. First Feis (if offered), Beginner and Advanced Beginner aka Beginner I and 2, must wear a class costume, or a skirt and blouse. All other categories are excluded from this rule. Modest attire is encouraged when a competitor is not dancing.
- Competitor's number must be worn and visible to adjudicators when
 performing in all competitions, use of reflective plastic number
 covers is discouraged.
- 8. Awards will be determined in proportion to the number of entries in each competition and to the degree of proficiency shown.
- Complaints must be in writing stating names and other factual
 information and signed by the complainant. A ten-dollar fee must be
 enclosed and presented to the Feis Chaiman within one hour of the
 occurrence. The fee will be returned if the complaint is upheld.
- 10. The Feis Committee and any organization affiliated with same, will not be held responsible for personal injury, property loss or damage. Destruction of Feis property or rental property will be punishable by law
- 11. The Feis reserves the right to reject any entry for cause, to cancel all or part of the Feis and to limit competitor's performing time. The decision of the feis Committee is final in all matters connected with the Feis.
- 12. All Feiseanna must have a process to allow parents to request that their child or children's name(s) not be listed on the posted competitor list prior to the day of the Feis.

- 13. Competitors must answer all questions as required by the Feis Entry committee, including teacher's name, and enclose the entry fee when mailing. Failure to do so will result in a rejected entry. Entries must be postmarked on or before the closing date or they will be subject to a late fee (Determined by the Feis).
- 14. Entrants in any Championship event may not enter in any other (Grade) events but may enter in Figure Dances. Entrants in Championships should specify, on the entry form, their choice of set dance. Entrants cannot change competitions or category on the day of the competition.
 - a. Dancers must qualify for open championship via the method now in place for preliminary championship, i.e. two 1st place wins.
 - b. Dancers must compete in the preliminary championship competition in order to qualify for open championship
 - The regional syllabus where the feis is being held may have different qualifications for entry.
- 15. Combining male and female dancers in any age categoly is left to the discretion of each region of the ID TAN A.
- 16. Preliminary Championships are open to those who, at any NAFC recognized Feis:
 - a. Have won 1st place in both an open/ prize winner light and heavy shoe competition, and
 - b. Have never won 1st, 2nd or 3rd in Open Championship.
 - c. A dancer who wins two first place awards will move on to Open Championship at the next Feis they enter, or as soon as the second win is achieved, in any age category, in the following years. Only in the case of back-to-back Feiseanna (successive days), in which case the first win in the first Feis will not change the dancer 's status for the second Feis.
 - d. A dancer is required to perform a light shoe dance (reel or slip jig for ladies and reel only for men), and a hard shoe dance. A Feis can opt to offer either a) a set dance orb) a jig/ hornpipe.
 - e. The regional syllabus where the feis is being held may have different qualifications for entry.
- Championships and Preliminary Championships require at least three adjudicators.
- 18. First place winners in the Open Championship category cannot return to a Preliminary or Open (Prizewinner) competition. Placing in a Regional or National Oireachtas does not change the status of a competitor. A dancer who moves into open championship must stay a minimum of 2 years. If after 2 years, they have not placed they are allowed to return to preliminary. An open championship dancer who places is not allowed to return to preliminary until 2 years after their last placement. The regional syllabus where the feis is being held may have different qualifications for entry.
- 19. The status of the dancer does not change unless there are five or more dancers in a competition.
- 20. Each region may determine the system for moving dancers from one grade to another, as they see appropriate for their region. The syllabus is to contain all grade categories, A Feis Committee may combine two consecutive age categories into the higher of the two categories within that grade when less than five (5) competitors are entered.
- 21. Beginner Grade: A beginner is a competitor who has not yet taken a full year of Irish Dance lessons, thereby giving beginners a full year with such status. A Beginner must move into the Advanced Beginner category the next year.
- 22. Musicians and adjudicators cannot be approached during a competition by anyone except the Feis Committee. No one can approach them while a competitor is performing.

- 23. Musicians employed by the Feis Committee will be solely under the direction and management of the Feis Committee on Feis day.
- 24. Teachers or team captains are responsible that their teams are complete and in position when the competition is announced. Competitors may compete in the next higher age group; however, a competitor may compete in only one age group.
- In matters pertaining to adjudication, the decision of the adjudicators is final.
- 26. Adjudicators are to monitor the quality of music at the stage(s) to which they are assigned.
- 27. First Feis (if offered), Beginner Advanced Beginner and Adult dancers are required to dance at traditional speeds. Novice and Open/Prizewinner dancers may choose between traditional and Oireachtas speeds.
- 28. The length of 2 hand and 3 hand dances in competition are to be 48 bars of music plus an 8-bar introduction
- 29. In consideration of safety and in fairness to dancers performing at a Feis, photography of any kind which has the capability of capturing a dancer's image while in motion is strictly forbidden.
- 30. A Feis may elect to allow in motion photography for publicity purposes, but the pictures are considered the sole property of the Feis and solely for Feis use only these are not be used for personal gain through commercial use or sale, and under no circumstances can they be published on any website or other areas, without the express written permission of the persons involved.
- 31. Additionally. a professional photographer may be formally contracted by a Feis to capture non-- motion photographs. such a portrait photography, awards ceremonies, etc. and/or in motion photography provided it is taken at a vendor station or suitable location: (a) away from the dancing stage and (b) requested by a consenting parent, guardian, or dancer (over the age of 18).
- 32. No bloc k, en Pointe, toe walking movements, stationary or moving is allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the under 12 age group. However, after September 1 of each year an exception is made for those dancers who are 11 dancing in the under 12 age group.
- 33. Make up is prohibited on a dancer in the first three grades (First Feis (if offered), Beginner and Advance Beginner or their equivalent) up to and including the under 12 age group.
- 34. Any competitor found to be using artificial carriage aids and subsequently refuses to remove same, will be subject to disqualification from that particular competition. Medically prescribed aids (proof of which may be required) will be exempt from this rule.
- 35. Each feis is required to li st their adjudicators on their syllabus and /or webs ite. One third of which are to be from outside the region where the Feis is being held.
- 36. Competitors in girl's competitions at the First Feis (if offered), Beginner and Advanced Beginner Grade will wear only the competitor's dancing School costume or a skirt and blouse.

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

- Beginner and Advanced Beginners must wear either a skirt and blouse or a school dress. NO solo costume allowed.
- The Open Championships Under 9 Age groups must dance a Traditional Set Piece.
- Championship Stage size for dancing 3 at a time is 32' wide by 24' long.
- Preliminary dancers who win 3 first places in a calendar year, must move to Open Championship the following calendar year. When a third 1ST place win is achieved over several calendar years, the dancer
- Adult female dancers must wear black tights
- Adult competitions can not be combined with other age groups (ie. Any non adult age group)

 Video recording is prohibited in all competitions except Beginner and Advanced Beginner Categories.

MUSIC SPEEDS

All regions in North America will follow this common set of speeds for all grade competitions at feiseanna in North America (IDTANA, 1/1/17).

NOTE: all grades dancers MUST dance the REEL 2 at a time. All other dances can be 3 at a time!
