Dear Teachers, Parents & Guardians,

We look forward to welcoming you to our 33rd Feis Glendarragh, due to be held on Sunday 1st October 2023. On behalf of the Glendarragh Dance Academy, we look forward to welcoming all those who have supported Feis Glendarragh in the past and hope to see new faces this year as well.

We are delighted to have acquired, the excellent facilities of Becket School. We will once again have access to the Large Championship Hall for set dances, Sports Hall with 2 full size championship stages and floor for grades as well as a gym, changing facilities and a practice area. The Becket School is situated within easy reach of East Midlands Airport, East Midlands Parkway Railway Station, Nottingham Railway station, and is very accessible by road with ample parking.

We are running combined Preliminary and Open Championships from U10-U15 Girls. The prelim result will be taken from the first 2 rounds of the championship result. We are running a separate Over 15 Mixed Preliminary competition which will consist 3 rounds, heavy round followed by light round, followed by set dance (There will be a recall if there 20 or more dancers).

We are also running separate Boys (double age group) Championships in the following age groups - U8-9, U10-11, U12-13, U14-15, U16-17 and Over 17.

The Championship/ Preliminary from U10-Senior will be adjudicated by 6 adjudicators, 3 on the first 2 rounds and then a separate panel of 3 adjudicators on the set round. There will be a 50% recall for more than 20 competitors. The U6-U9 championship will be adjudicated by a panel of 3 adjudicators and there will be 100% recall.

Once again, we will be having a Champion of Champions competition and those who place in the top three, in any of the Championships, will be eligible to compete. We have cups for these competitions, in memory of Denis Holtham and Helen Stack, two of our most loyal and longstanding parents who passed away in 2013. We feel it is a fitting tribute for two people who had such a love of Irish Dancing.



Grade Competitions

All grade competitions are 'trophy dances' where 1st, 2nd and 3rd will receive trophies.

All results will be awarded in a separate Results area to ensure smooth running of the next competitions.

32 Bar System

ALL dancers in the competition will be lined up at the side of the stage at the start of the competition. The first two dancers will walk into starting positions and get ready to dance. After the 8 bar introduction the dancers will begin their dance for 32 bars. After 32 bars they bow and walk off the stage while the next 2 dancers walk into their starting position to get ready to commence their performance of 32 bars - this is repeated until all dances have completed their dance.

Please Note: There will be a gap of 8 bars in between each 2 dancers.

The content of the 32 bar performance is at the discretion of each teacher. There will be stage stewards on each stage counting the next 2 dancers in and <u>dancers will not be penalised for starting late or continuing after 32 bars.</u>

Tiny Tots

Here is where we celebrate the upcoming stars in Irish Dancing. It was a great atmosphere at the last feis and all the children, families, teachers and adjudicators enjoyed it. Each dancer will <u>perform 16 bars</u> of Reel and will receive a special gift, trophy and a sash for taking part.


All U5 ungraded dancers and any U6 and U7 dancers that don't feel ready to do 32 bars in the Novice competition are welcome to take part.

FROM THE M1 SOUTH - NORTH

Leave the M1 at Junction 24 and take the 4th exit (if coming from the South) or 1st exit (if coming from the North) onto the A453 signposted Nottingham South. Keep following the A453 until you come to a roundabout signposted Grantham, Melton, Newark and take the 1st exit onto the A52. At mini roundabout continue forward onto Clifton Lane - B679 signposted West Bridgford. At mini-roundabout bear right onto Wilford Lane B679 signposted through traffic. Turn left into The Becket Way which is the entrance to school.

RULES AS OF JUNE 2023

These rules should be read in conjunction with rules laid out by An Coimisiun Le Rinci Galeacha. - Link Microsoft Word -Rules of An Comisiun le Rince Gaelachta 01 Jan 2020 (updated 30 Jun 2022).doc (clrg.ie)

1. GENERAL

- 1.1 Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 1.2 Committee members only may approach adjudicators.
- 1.3 Any protest against breach of rules must be made in writing to the feis organiser within one hour of conclusion of a competition, with a fee of £25.00. Should the objection be upheld the fee will be refunded.
- 1.4 Entries will only be accepted from schools registered with An Coimisiun.
- 1.5 Lodgement of entries at a feis implies that you accept the rules relating to the feis in their entirety as laid down by the An Coimisiún le Rinci Gaelacha & Midland Regional Council.

2. AGE GROUPS

- 2.1 Age to be taken from 1st January of the current year. Where a competitor's birthday falls on 1st January he/she shall, be regarded as under the age attained on that day.
- 2.2 Competitors must dance in their own age group for solo competitions except where there is no provision for that dance in that age group.

3. GRADES

- 3.1 At any one Feis, a dancer may only dance each Solo Dance in ONE grade.
- Exception Dancers ARE permitted to dance in both Novice Reel and Primary Reel competitions.
- 3.2 Novice Confined to competitors who have not progressed out of Novice grade (including Trophy Competitions) for that particular dance in any age group.

Primary - Confined to competitors who have not progressed out of Primary grade (including Trophy Competitions) for that particular dance in any age group.

Intermediate – confined to competitors who have not progressed out of Intermediate grade (including Trophy Competitions) for that particular dance in their present age group.

Open – Open solo dancers must be on syllabus for U6 – U9 age groups.

- 3.3 All grade competitions are open to all regions.
- 3.4 In a trophy competition, a dancer must have performed their choice of dance in the solo competition.
- 3.5 Grade Progression is as follows:

Novice & Primary	5 or less 6-10 11-20 21+	0 1 Dancer 2 Dancers 3 Dancers
Intermediate	5 or less More than 5	0 1st place only











4. PRELIMINARY/OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS AND PREMIER COMPETITIONS:

- 4.1 Championship/Premier Competitions Only Intermediate and Open dancers are eligible to compete (except under 6 and 7 – all grades are allowed to compete).
- 4.2 Under 6s & under 7s Championships/Premier must dance Reel & Light Jig or Hop (Single) Jig.
- 4.3 Under 8s and Under 9s must dance Reel and Heavy Jig. A recall is at the discretion of the feis organisers.
- 4.4 Under 10 and up. All dancers must be given a choice of Reel or Slip Jig and Jig or Hornpipe and recall set dance.
- 4.5 Subsidiary solos may be run at the discretion of the feis organisers.
- 4.6 IF a minimum number is stated for ANY championship to be held, then this must be consistent for ALL championship competitions. E.g., if you decide on a minimum number of 5 in order to run a separate boys or prelim championship then this must be consistent with the number required to run any championship

4.7 PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

- A minimum number of three Adjudicators must officiate.
- The first age group for a Preliminary Championship is Under 10.
- Where a Preliminary Championship is held separate from an Open Championship, three rounds should be offered, namely; Reel or Slip Jig, Heavy Jig or Hornpipe and any Set Dance.
- Where a Preliminary Championship is combined with an Open Championship, then the result should be taken from eligible dancers' ranking after the first two rounds.
- Where there are separate Preliminary and Open Championships, dancers can compete in both at the discretion of the Feis organiser.
- Where a competitor wins two Preliminary Championships, they must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
 - For grading purposes, two wins will be taken as being in any two-year rolling period. Where a dancer does not win a second Preliminary within two years of winning their first Preliminary Championship, then the first win will be deemed as having expired and the dancer starts afresh.
 - Where there are less than 6* in a Preliminary Championship that win will not normally be considered for grading purposes. However, where a dancer wins three Preliminary Championships regardless of the number of competitors in each competition, that dancer must dance in Open Championship for a period of 12 months thereafter.
- Dances performed in a Preliminary Championships do not count for grading in solo competitions.
- Dancers placing 1st-3rd in an Open Championship with up to 20* competitors or 1st-5th in an Open Championship with more than 20* Competitors cannot compete in a Preliminary Championship for a period of 12 month.
- 4.8 The Midland region allows dancers to participate in any 1 round of preliminary champs as a separate solo round these dancers should not be included in the numbers indicated above with *.

5. DANCE MOVEMENTS

- 5.1 In Novice Grades only basic steps should be performed i.e. no intricate movements.
- 5.2 Rules appertaining to Dance movements such as toe movements as laid out by An Coimisiun apply

7. COSTUME & MAKE-UP

- 7.1All costume and make-up rules as laid out by An Coimisiun apply Link Updated Costume Rules at 01 Jul 21.doc (live.com)
- 7.2Undergarments Appropriate undergarments covering the midriff must be worn. Dancers wearing undergarments that do not cover the areas of the body as in the illustrated will be asked to put on black tights of a denier of not less than 70. See here for illustrations Costume drawings (clrg.ie) Microsoft Word - Rules and Motions Passed by CLRG since 01 Sep
- 7.3 Under no circumstances should dancers walk around any dancing venue in their underwear. Neither should dancers (regardless of age) change in to or out of costume in the main dancing hall, if at all possible. At all times, dancers should be properly attired.

8. FIGURE AND CEILI

- 8.1 Rules regarding age and re-dancing as laid out by An Coimisiun apply.
- 8.2 Figure Championship in the U7's year group may be a 6 hand dance, 8 hand Ceili or Figure Dance of 6 or more
- 8.3 Mixed Ceili A mixed team must consist of at least 2 boys or 2 girls. .

9. MEDIA POLICY

9.1 Any form of unauthorised photography, which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means e.g. mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, commercial film, with or without enhancement, is expressly forbidden during competitions.

10. CARRIAGE AIDS - All rules as set out in CLRG rules must be adhered to.

- 10.1 Any competitor found to be using artificial carriage aids and subsequently refuses to remove same, will be subject to disqualification. Medically prescribed apparatus (proof of which may be required) will be exempt from this ruling.
- 10.2 Any competitor wearing their shoes on the wrong feet will be treated in the same manner as if using carriage aids and be subject to disqualification.
- 10.3 In order to comply with health and safety measures, dancers may be required to perform the simple exercise of raising arms to shoulder level unhindered. If unable to do this due to costume stitching or arm attachments these dancers will not be permitted to perform.












11. ORDER OF DANCING, CONDUCT, MISHAPS ETC

- 11.1 Should a dancer lose a heel or a complete shoe or have an open lace he/she may stand back allowing the other dancer(s), where applicable, to continue dancing uninhibited. In such a case, the dancer concerned will be permitted to redance as soon as it is deemed practicable by the stage steward.
- 11.2 Should a dancer fall on stage, whether in solos or in teams, the adjudicator MUST ring the bell to stop the performance of the dancer(s). Dancers so affected will be permitted to redance and will be marked then at the discretion of each individual adjudicator. If a dancer falls during the last 8 bars of any performance, then he/she would only be required to dance the last 16 bars of that dance.
- 11.3 Should a dancer slip, bump into another dancer or have a costume malfunction whether in solos or in teams, the bell will be rung at the discretion of the adjudicators to stop the performance of the dancer(s). Dancers so affected will be permitted to redance and will be marked then at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
- 11.4 Where a dancer fails to complete his / her performance in any given round, that dancer will automatically receive ZERO marks from all adjudicators for that round.
- 11.5 Competitors beginning to dance before or after the stipulated set dance introduction will automatically receive ZERO marks from all adjudicators for that round.
- 11.6 A competitor must not walk off the stage during a performance unless instructed to do so by an adjudicator. A dancer who dismisses themself from the stage without the permission of an adjudicator will not be marked for that particular dance.
