Please find *fee per dancer / section* listed below.

- An event / venue levy of **\$25.00** will apply to each family. This will only be paid once per family regardless of how many dancers are competing or how many days they compete.
- Age as of 1st January 2023 and Gradings as of AIDA QLD / relevant State at the time of entry.
- Championships will be even ages with the exception of the senior competition: 6 Years; 8 Years, 10 Years; 12 Years; 14 Years; 16 Years; 18 Years; 20 Years, 21 Years and over.
 *Numbers permitting, however, it may change at the discretion of the organizing committee.
- There will be **3 adjudicators** for the Open Championships with a championship result <u>AND</u> 2 additional solo rounds results from the **4th adjudicator**. Dancers will perform all three championship dances <u>ONCE</u> on the day.
- The 4th adjudicator will judge Rounds 1 and 2 and will give two individual results separate to the championship result. The 4th adjudicator will also write comments for each competitor during the set dance round which will be available to purchase directly after the competition for a fee.
- **100% Recall** for ALL Championships.
- The 6 Years Championship will dance the *Light Jig* for Round 1, *Single Jig* for Round 2, *Reel* for Round 3. The Reel may be danced at either *beginner speed (124), primary speed (116), intermediate / open speed (113)*.
- The 8 Years Championship will dance the Reel (speed 124 or 116 or 113) for Round 1, Light Jig (116) or Open Heavy Jig (73) for Round 2, Single Jig (124) or Traditional Set Dance for Round 3.
- Dancers may choose to do Championship <u>and</u> Premiership <u>and</u> Individual Dances. There will be a scheduled Prizegiving slot at the end of each session. There is no limit on the number of dances a dancer may enter and compete in.
- There will be an additional <u>Soft Shoe step-down-the-line competition</u> directly following each light round / 2nd round of the championship. Dancers will compete in the same age group that they dance in their Championship. This entry will be \$10 and open to every age group from 8 years and above only.
- In the 8 years step-down-the-line, dancers in the younger ages are eligible to dance,
 e.g., a 6 years dancer may dance a Reel (113) step in this section.
- If there are enough boys' entries from 15 years and above, a separate <u>15 and over Boys</u>
 <u>Championship may be made.</u> *Subject to change based on entries.
- THREE Traditional Set Dance Cup Competitions will be offered. 10 and under Cup, 11 16 Years Cup, 17 Years and over Senior Cup.
- Each championship winner will have the opportunity to take part in a digital *'Parade of Champions'* whereby they submit a recording of themselves doing a step for a video collaboration put together by the organizers to be posted online after the event.

- Preliminary entrants will dance in the main championship and will receive an overall Championship result <u>AND</u> an additional Preliminary result. The winner of the Preliminary result will receive a perpetual tiara or crown. <u>All</u> preliminary entrants will receive an additional prelim award.
- Beginner, Primary & Intermediate age groups will be timetabled according to entry numbers.
- There will be a Trophy Reel Dance for Beginner & Primary and a Trophy Light Dance for Intermediate grades (ages may be combined dependent on numbers). The trophy dance winners will receive a trophy <u>AND</u> a plush toy winner's prize. All competitors in the trophy dance will receive an award.
- All dancers in the Individual medal grade events will receive a place and a medal.
- Intermediate Heavy Shoe Individual Dances (Heavy Jig & Hornpipe) will be danced 32 bars in length.
- Premiership sections will be judged by one adjudicator. Dancers may choose two dances from the list below. Dancers may only choose to dance in <u>one</u> premiership in <u>one</u> grade.
- Premiership dances must be indicated on the entry form, <u>these cannot be changed on</u> <u>the day of the competition</u>. Single age groups will only be run if sufficient entries are received. <u>Dancers must choose dances reflective of their grade for the premierships</u>. For example, if a dancer is selecting the Beginner Premiership and has previously graded out of their Beginner Reel & Beginner Light Jig, then they must choose their Beginner Single Jig & Beginner Slip Jig for their Premiership dances.
- There will be a SPECIAL EVENT entitled The Character Reel for all dancers aged 8 years and under. Dancers will be permitted to dress in their favourite "Character" Costume, e.g. *Mini Mouse, Spiderman, Princess Elsa,* etc and peform 16 bars of <u>any</u> Reel step (Speeds 113 or 116 or 124) in either soft shoes <u>or</u> heavy shoes. Please note costume length and modesty rules apply. Hair pieces and makeup permitted. No props permitted. All parts of costumes must be secured and not create any form of hazard. Use of arms permitted. Dancers will dance to the music supplied by the organizers. Top 5 dancers will receive a Disney plush toy. All dancers will receive a prize.
- Enter on the Day *The Rising Stars of the Sunshine State.* Pre-beginner unregistered dancers will have the opportunity to take to the stage and wow us with their performance! Section will not be judged, and <u>ALL participants will receive a medal.</u>

PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIPS CRITERIA

- 1. Preliminary Championships will be offered in all sections from 8 Years of age.
- 2. Preliminary Championship will be danced as part of the Open Championship.
- 3. Entry to the Preliminary Championships will be restricted to the following:

a. Dancers who have never won an Open Championship <u>excluding 6 Years and under</u> <u>Championship wins.</u>

b. Dancers who did not attain a top five position at the Australian National Championships in 2022.

4. Preliminary Championship result will be calculated after the 2nd round of the Open Championship. All prelim entrants will receive an award.

5. Dancers cannot enter the Preliminary Championship unless they have entered the Open Championships in the same age group.

6. Dancers entering Championship or Championship/Preliminary Championship combined can also enter **one graded Premiership** if eligible and individual dances if eligible.

PREMIERSHIP SECTIONS

- Beginner A Premiership: Choice of two soft shoe dances (Reel, Light Jig, Single Jig, Slip Jig).
- 2. Primary A Premiership: Choice of two soft shoe dances (Reel, Light Jig, Single Jig, Slip Jig).
- Primary B Premiership: Choice of <u>one</u> soft shoe dance (Reel, Light Jig, Single Jig, Slip Jig) and <u>one</u> heavy shoe dance (Heavy Jig 82 or 92, Traditional Set Dance). If a dancer has graded into Primary for their Heavy Jig, they are permitted to dance Heavy Jig at speed 82 or 92 in the Primary B Premiership.

COMPETITION RULES

1. Competitors must be pupils of teachers registered with An Coimisiun le Rinci Gaelacha, Dublin and be registered to compete with an appropriate regional authority for 2023.

2. Entries must be submitted on the official form, stating the competitor's registration number, accompanied by the correct fee and signed by the registered teacher. Dancers will compete using their AIDA QLD numbers. All interstate dancers will be provided with a number.

3. Sections will run at the discretion of the organizer. If a section cannot be run due to insufficient numbers, some age groups may be combined. If a suitable combination cannot be made, teachers will be contacted to make an alternative arrangement.

4. Solo competitors may dance in BOTH any grade AND the Open Championship AND a Premiership if eligible.

5. All dancers must report to the marshalling area when called, or risk disqualification.

6. The feis committee reserves the right to change the order of dances / dancers at any time.

7. In the case of a tie there will be no dance-off.

8. Competitors will be required to dance to the music provided by the live musician assigned to the event and / or in cases where there is no live music, recorded music will be provided by the organizers.

9. A dancer will be permitted to re dance under the following conditions:

(i) any problem with the music

(ii) loss of a heel or complete shoe provided they stand back and allow the other dancer to continue dancing

(iii) bump, slip or fall

at the adjudicator's discretion.

10. Where a dancer fails to complete his / her performance in any given round in a Championship, the dancer will receive zero marks from each adjudicator for that round.

11. The feis committee reserves the right to shorten dances by 8 bars in championship competitions to ensure the smooth running of the weekend.

12. The Adjudicator's decision is final, and any protests must be submitted in writing to the feis committee and accompanied by a fee of \$50.00. The fee will be forfeited if the objection is overruled.

13. Competitors enter the competition at their own risk regarding injury.

14. To receive prizes and awards competitors must be in full dancing costume including dancing shoes.

15. Any Form of unauthorized photography which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means, e.g., mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, cine recorder, commercial film, with or without flash enhancement, is expressly forbidden in competition unless prior permission has been given by the Feis

organizers. This rule does not apply to the filming of Beginner Dancers or the Character Reel from the designated filming area.

16. Costume and Make-up must comply with the current guidelines adopted by AIDA Inc. Adjudicators who determine a costume to be too short or to lack modesty, may ask a competitor to change into black tights (of a denier no less than 70) in order for the dancer to continue in the competition. Make up and leg tan will not be permitted for any dancer in Novice, Beginner (Bun) and Primary (Tus) for 11 years and under.

17. No block, en point, stationary or moving, will be allowed to be performed for all ages, up to and including 11 years and under age groups.

18. The use of artificial arm or carriage aids is not permitted.

19. Photography of dancers in the Novice and Beginner sections will be allowed following the guidelines set down by AIDA Qld Inc.

20. The photography of any dancer performing in Primary Level events or above is expressly forbidden.

21. All other AIDA QLD / AIDA Inc competition rules will be complied with.

22. Lodgment of an entry form shall be taken to signify that the Teacher, Pupil and Parents concerned accept and agree to strictly abide by all of the above rules.

23. All competitors will endeavor to always be respectful and mindful of other competitors on stage. Use of good stage etiquette is a condition of entry.

24. Bullying and/or intimidation by competitors of any sort in the marshalling area, on stage, at prizegiving, anywhere in the venue or via social media in relation to the event <u>will not be</u> <u>tolerated</u>. Any evidence of such will result in:

(i) the immediate fortification of a dancer's entry and result regardless of whether they have already danced or not.

(ii) a detailed report of any anti-social behavior being submitted by the organizers to the AIDA Inc Ethics Committee.

25. Dancers competing in Beginner and / or Primary Grade up to and including 11 years may only wear Team costume. Girls may wear a skirt and top with no sleeveless tops permitted. Solo costumes and wigs are not permitted in Beginners or Primary up to and including 11 years. Boys may wear their team costume, shorts / trousers / kilt and shirt.

26. Lead round in heavy dances - In all competitions for Primary level upwards, all heavy dancing i.e Jig & Hornpipe, the Lead Round must be danced on both right & left foot.

27. In accordance with our obligations under the Protection policy, dancers are reminded to always wear appropriate clothing whilst at the Feis (especially in the auditorium area). **NB** This means that shorts / skirt must be worn over leotards and bloomers at all times.
