COMPETITION RULES

1. Competitors must be pupils of teachers registered with An Coimisiun le Rinci Gaelacha, Dublin and be registered to compete with an appropriate regional authority for 2023.
2. Entries must be submitted on the official form, stating the competitor's registration number, accompanied by the correct fee and signed by the registered teacher.
3. Sections will run at the discretion of the organiser. In the event that a section cannot be run due to insufficient numbers entry fees will be refunded after discussion with the Teacher.
4. Solo competitors may dance at either the Intermediate level or the Open level, not both. Dancers must be graded at the Intermediate level or lower for the required dances to compete in the Intermediate Premiership.
5. Dancers may enter a total of 5 solo sections, in Beginner and Primary events excluding Novice. In the event that this needs to be reduced following the closing of entries entry fees for sections cancelled will be refunded.
6. All dancers must report to the marshalling area when called, or risk disqualification.
7. Competitors must be ready to dance on stage **half an hour** before the appointed times, unless under extreme circumstances, such circumstances will be considered by the organising committee. The decision of the organising committee will be final.
8. The committee of the QIA Dancers reserves the right to change the order of dances / dancers at any time.

9. In the case of a tie there will be no dance-off.
10. Competitors will be required to dance to the music provided by the committee of the QIA Dancers. Teachers will be required to supply choreography sections, unless previously arranged with the committee. Teachers are to ensure that speeds are checked at the times allocated.
11. A dancer will be permitted to re dance under the following conditions:
- any problem with the music (either recorded or live)
 - loss of a heel or complete shoe provided they stand back and allow the other dancer to continue dancing.
 - at the adjudicator's discretion.
12. The Adjudicator's decision is final, and any protests must be submitted in writing to the committee of the Q.I.A. Dancers and accompanied by a fee of \$25.00. The fee will be forfeited if the objection is overruled.
13. Competitors enter the competition at their own risk regarding injury.
14. To receive prizes and awards competitors must be in full dancing costume including dancing shoes.
15. Any Form of unauthorised photography which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means, e.g. mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, cine recorder, commercial film, with or without flash enhancement, is expressly forbidden in competition unless prior permission has been given by the Feis organisers.
16. Costume and Make-up must comply with the current guidelines adopted by AIDA Inc. and CLRG.
- Beginner and Primary level – Dancers 11 years and under are required to wear a traditional class costume or appropriate attire, they may not wear tan, make-up or wigs. Dancers 12 years and over do not have these restrictions. Dancers in the 7 & 8 years Intermediate and Open sections will not be able to wear make-up including false eyelashes but will be permitted to wear leg tan.
17. No block, en point, stationary or moving, will be allowed to be performed for all ages, up to and including 11 years and under age groups.
18. The use of artificial arm aids is not permitted
19. Photography of dancers in the Novice and Beginner sections will be allowed following the guidelines set down by AIDA Qld Inc.
20. The photography of any dancer performing in Primary Level events or above is expressly forbidden.
21. All other AIDA QLD Inc. competition rules will be complied with.
22. Lodgement of an entry form shall be taken to signify that the Teacher, Pupil and Parents concerned accept and agree to strictly abide by all of the above rules.



SECTIONS

- Competitors will be permitted to enter 5 solo sections across all levels.
- Dancers are only permitted to enter a maximum of 2 Aggregate sections and a maximum of 2 trophy events across 2 levels.
- Sections will be divided up into single ages (where numbers permit).
- Aggregates will be awarded for the following dances at the level indicated. Beginners
 - Reel and Light Jig
 - Slip Jig and Treble Jig
- Primary
 - Reel and Traditional Set Dance
 - Light Jig and Single Jig
- Combined
 - Slip Jig and Treble Jig
 - Primary Reel and Beginners Treble Jig
- Adult
 - Light Jig and Single Jig.

Primary

Reel (122, 116 or 113), Light Jig, Single Jig, Slip Jig (124 or 120), Treble Jig (92 or 82), Hornpipe (144), Traditional Set Dance (Trophy Dance).

Intermediate Own Choice Set Dance

Open to dancers not competing in the Open Title. Age groups will be set based on entries

SOLO COMPETITORS MAY ENTER THE INTERMEDIATE PREMIERSHIP OR THE OPEN TITLE, NOT BOTH.

Intermediate Premierhips

N.B. – All Hard Shoe Dances will be 32 bars for the Intermediate Level

Dancers may enter the Premiership as a whole or just an individual dance.

8 & under – Reel and Traditional Set

10 & under – Jig/Hornpipe and Reel/Slip Jig

12 & under – Jig/Hornpipe and Reel/Slip Jig

14 & under – Jig/Hornpipe and Reel/Slip Jig

16 & under – Jig/Hornpipe and Reel/Slip Jig

17 & over – Jig/Hornpipe and Reel/Slip Jig

Open Titles

N.B. – Jigs will be 48 bars and Hornpipes will be 40 bars at this level (except for the 8 & under section which will be 32 bars)

8 & under – Jig, Reel and Traditional Set Dance
10 & under – Jig/Hornpipe, Reel/Slip Jig and Set Dance
12 & under – Jig/Hornpipe, Reel/Slip Jig and Set Dance
14 & under – Jig/Hornpipe, Reel/Slip Jig and Set Dance
16 & under – Jig/Hornpipe, Reel/Slip Jig and Set Dance
17 & 18 yrs – Jig/Hornpipe, Reel/Slip Jig and Set Dance
19 & over – Jig/Hornpipe, Reel/Slip Jig and Set Dance

Treble Reel – Step About (16 bars)

Age groups will be as per the Title Sections

Dancers will dance individually. Dancers will go on to the stage in groups of 5 competitors and dance step about. Dancers will be required to dance to the music supplied by the Organising Committee.

Choreography Sections

Beginner and Primary – Reel in Couples

1. Dancers may only perform movements accepted at the Beginner and Primary levels.
2. Maximum of 48 bars in Reel time.
3. Age groups will be allocated based on entries.

Open

1. Dances must be performed in Reel time.
2. Reel in Couples must be no longer than 72 bars.
3. Three Hand Choreography must be no longer than 96 bars.
4. Dances may be performed in either hard or soft shoes.

5. Speed of music must be checked on the supplied equipment during the allocated period.

Reel in Couples – 12 years & under
Reel in Couples – 16 years & under
Reel in Couples – 17 years & over

Three Hand Choreography – 12 years & under
Three Hand Choreography – 13 years & over
