Required no of bars are:

Under 10 upwards – 40 Bars Slip Jig & Hornpipe: 48 Bars Reel & Heavy Jig

Solo Medals will be awarded for the first two rounds of each solo championship.

Separate 8 Hand Girls & Mixed Ceili Championships in the following age groups;

Under 10, Under 12, Under 15, Under 18 & Senior

Combined 4 Hand Ceili Championships in the following age groups;

Under 12, Under 15 & Over 15.

All Ceili Championships (**1 round with 3 adjudicators**) **Part A or Part B** can be danced.

RULES OF THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. A dancer's age group will be determined as from 1st January 2026.
2. Entries will only be accepted from dancing teachers registered with An Coimisiún Le Rinci Gaelacha for the year 2025/2026.
3. The adjudicators' decision is final. Only members of the NW Teachers & Adjudicators Association/NWRC and those officially assisting them may approach the adjudicators during competitions.
4. Complaints will only be accepted from registered teachers, in writing, and must be accompanied by a fee of £50.00, which may be refunded if the North West Teachers & Adjudicators Association/NWRC upholds said objection.
5. Teachers are advised that all details required on the entry forms must be completed. Entry forms received in contravention of this rule will be returned.
6. All competitors must be ready to dance 30 minutes prior to the published time. They must also report to the stage stewards promptly and dance in the prescribed order. Failure to report in time to dance in order will lead to disqualification. Competitors are strongly advised to check the timetable for last-minute changes to times or halls, both leading up to the event and on the day of competition.
7. In all rounds, the minimum speeds of music as laid down by An Coimisiún will apply.
8. All Solo Championships will be a 100% Recall.
9. All cups and shields are perpetual awards. These are the responsibility of the holder for the relevant year, who is responsible for loss and any damage not previously reported. Such cups and shields must be returned in good time for the corresponding competitions next year.
10. With respect to team competitions, please refer to the rules in the An Coimisiún syllabus for Oireachtas Rince Na Cruinne 2026.
11. The NW Teachers Association have made every effort to ensure that the stages are of the correct specification in design and structure, taking into account health and safety issues. All stages are covered with Harlequin flooring. By entering the championships, competitors accept that neither the NW Teachers Association or the Bolton Stadium Hotel can't be held liable for any incident or event which could not be reasonably foreseen.
12. In the event of a dispute not covered by any of the rules of these championships, reference will be made to the Rules of An Coimisiún, appertaining to the issue or matter in dispute.
13. In all heavy dances the lead-round must be danced on both right and left feet.
14. Competitors will dance the following:
 - U6 & U7 - 40 bars in Reel, Single Jig, Light Jig & Heavy Jig (All Rounds must be danced)
 - U8 & U9 - 40 bars in Reel and Heavy Jig and Traditional Set Dance (All Rounds must be danced)
 - U10 – Senior - 48 bars in the Reel and Heavy Jig, 40 bars in the Slip Jig and Hornpipe
15. A dancer who fails to dance or complete rounds one or two of a championship will receive ZERO marks from all Adjudicators for that round and will not feature in the recall. Where there is 100% recall the competitor will be allowed to dance the third round as a courtesy but will not appear in the final result. This includes competitors who do not complete the correct number of bars by starting either before or after the 8 bar introduction.
16. The onus of ensuring that the stage steward is informed of the correct name and metronomic speed of the nominated Open Set Dance will rest with the competitor.
17. An incorrect metronomic speed submitted for an Open Set Dance can only be changed prior to the commencement of the Open Set Dance round.
18. Introduction to Open Set Dances will be played only once and no alteration in that speed of music will be permitted.
19. Should a competitor commence dancing to an incorrect metronomic speed submitted to the stage steward then that competitor must continue to dance at that speed as no further opportunity of tempo change will be afforded.
20. Should a dancer lose a heel, a toe-piece, a complete shoe or have an open lace, they may stand back – allowing the other dancer(s), where applicable, to continue dancing uninhibited. In such a case, the dancer concerned will be permitted to re-dance without penalty.



21. Should a dancer:
 - A) fall on stage, whether in solos or in teams, the adjudicator **MUST** ring the bell to stop the performance of the dancer(s). Dancers so affected will be permitted to re-dance, and will be marked at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
 - B) Slip, bump into another dancer or have a costume malfunction whether in solos or in teams, the bell may be rung at the discretion of the adjudicators to stop the performance of the dancer(s). Dancers so affected will be permitted to re-dance, and will be marked at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
 - C) In the opinion of the stage steward and/or a medical professional (if necessary), be deemed unfit to re-dance, but insists on their right to do so, then the dancer concerned will only be permitted to re-dance upon completion of a declaration form exonerating the *NW Teachers & Adjudicators Association/NWRC* of liability for any consequences. Any repeat accident/incident which results in that dancer being unable to complete the required number of bars of any round, will result in the dancer withdrawing without question from the championship.
22. If the adjudicators ring the bell:
 - A) to stop a performance during the last eight (8) bars in Round 1 or Round 2, the dancers will only be required to dance the last 16 bars of that dance.
 - B) to stop a performance during any part of their open solo set dance, the dancer will perform the entire dance for their re-dance.
 - C) to stop a performance any sooner than the last eight (8) bars during a RE DANCE in Round 1 or Round 2, the adjudicators will decide (by majority vote) if a full dance is required or if an exception can be made to require only the last 16 bars of that dance.
23. In the case of all re-dances, such shall occur as soon as it is deemed practicable by the stage steward and no sooner than after five rotations of dancers. Where such occurs at the end of a competition, an equivalent amount of recovery time (approximately seven minutes) will be afforded to the dancer(s).
24. A competitor must not walk off the stage during a performance unless instructed to do so by an adjudicator or stage steward. A dancer who dismisses themselves from the stage without such permission will receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators.
25. If at any time during a performance on stage an adjudicator feels that due to the health and safety of a performer on stage that the performance should be stopped, the adjudicator **MUST** ring the bell. This does not guarantee a re-dance and/or re-marking for the competitor.
26. Respect for fellow competitors on stage is a requirement at all times. Lack of respect or courtesy for fellow competitors by aggressive dancing on stage will be subject to penalty at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
27. If a competitor sustains injury or illness during the course of a competition, and the organisers have reason to believe that such an illness or injury could be exacerbated by continued participation, he/she will be advised to retire from the competition. If this advice is ignored, then prior to continuation, the dancer (or in the case of a child or young person (5 to 17 years) an appropriate adult) will be required to sign a disclaimer form, which will be retained in the event of a possible future enquiry.
28. Any form of unauthorised photography which has the capability of capturing a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means, e.g. mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, cine recorder, commercial film, with or without flash enhancement, is expressly forbidden during competitions. Photographs taken at awards ceremonies are permitted. However, these must be for your own use, and not for public display purposes unless permission has been obtained.
29. The rules of CLRG as regards standards of dress must be adhered to in public areas of the venue; discretion must be exerted when dancers are changing for competitions. Changing areas will be provided.
30. Dancers taking part in results ceremonies will not be permitted to go onto stage to receive any award unless in full costume and wearing black dance shoes.
31. All dancers deserve the same respect and ovation on completion of their performance. Excessive and unique verbal celebrations will not be tolerated on completion of a performance.



32. Your attention is drawn to the legal position with regard to smoking in public places or buildings in England. The Bolton Stadium Hotel is designated as such a public place, and smoking is therefore forbidden in all parts of the building. It is further recommended that hair spray and similar cosmetic or hygienic spray substances should not be used in the public area(s) within the venue.
33. In the event of unacceptable behaviour in the venue on the part of any member of the Irish dancing community, for the duration of the Championships, the Bolton Stadium Hotel management reserve the right to deal with those who are responsible in accordance with their policies appertaining to such situations. The NW Teachers will support such action with regarding unacceptable behaviour.
34. By entering the British National Championships, all dancers and/or their legal guardians acknowledge and consent to the British National Championships recording, photographing, live-streaming, and/or otherwise capturing their participation during the event, including their performances. These recordings and images may be used for event coverage, promotional materials, and on the British Nationals Championships website and associated social media.
