GENERAL RULES OF THE OIREACHTAS

This Oireachtas is conducted under the Rules and Regulations of An Coimisiún le Rincí Gaelacha (CLRG) and the Australian Irish Dancing Association Inc. (AIDA Inc.).

- 1) In order for entries to be accepted teachers must note that all competitors:
 - a. competitors must be pupils of teachers who at the date of entry are registered with CLRG for the year 2024-2025, and, if Australian Resident, who are financial members of AIDA Inc. for 2025;
 - b. Competitors if resident in Australia must be fully registered with AIDA Inc. by the official closing date of entries: **Wednesday 28th May.** Australian Resident dancers not registered at the closing date will incur an additional penalty of \$150-00;
 - c. competitors must not on the date(s) of their competitions(s) be ineligible to compete due to any rule;
 - d. competitors must have been formally entered and entry fees paid in full by the official closing date;
 - e. teachers must not have any overdue monies owing to AIDA Inc.

LODGEMENT OF ENTRIES

- 2) The website for lodgement of entries is https://app.feisfwd.com. The website provides clear instructions on how to complete the lodgement process. All entries must be lodged through this website and full payment made by the official closing date of Wednesday 28th May. Payment must be made by credit cards Visa or MasterCard. Late entries will be accepted up until Monday 2nd June 2025 with a payment of double entry fee. No entries can be lodged online after Monday 2nd June 2025.
- 3) Following lodgement through the FeisFWD application, an email confirming all entries submitted will immediately be sent to the account holder..
- 4) Solo entries are submitted by the dancer's parent/guardian, or by the dancer themselves if over 18 years of age. Teachers are able to view the details of their student's entries from within the FeisFWD application to verify the submission is correct in all regards. See http://www.feisfwd.com/aidainc for details.
- 5) Freestyle entries are submitted by teachers. Instructions for this process can be found at http://www.feisfwd.com/aidainc
- 6) Entries are unable to be submitted after the official closing date. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 7) No refunds will be made for any entry money received.

AGE LIMITS

8) The age of a competitor shall be taken as on 1st January 2025. Where a competitor's birth date falls on the 1st January they shall, for the purpose of the Australian International Oireachtas be regarded as under the age attained on that day.

CHAMPIONSHIP PRIZES

9) Recalls awarded will be 50% of the number of competitors entered in each open solo championship section from 9 years and over solo girls and ladies sections. Non-recall dancers participating in either the Traditional Set Dance or Light Shoe Step Down The Line will receive a medal with the winner receiving a trophy. In all solo competitions, including Príomh Comórtaisí and preliminary competitions, prizes will be awarded to the top 50% of dancers as entered (i.e. if 10 dancers enter, 5 will receive prizes even if only 8 dancers compete on the day). If there are 5 or fewer dancers entered in a solo competition, all dancers will receive a prize. All teams in the Freestyle Championship will receive a prize.

ADJUDICATION, ORDER OF DANCING, CONDUCT & MISHAPS

- 10) In the Open Championships the first two rounds will be judged by a panel of three (3) adjudicators. Recall rounds will be judged by a different panel of three (3) adjudicators. Note: In the 6, 7, and 8 Years Open Championships sections the same panel of three (3) adjudicators will judge all three rounds
- 11) Príomh Comórtaisí competitions will be judged by one adjudicator selected by the Organising Committee (AIDA Inc. Council).
- 12) Competitors must:
 - a. Obey all instructions of the Organising Committee otherwise permission to dance will be withdrawn;
 - b. Dance in numerical order as published in the official program
 - c. Note that AIDA Inc. has the right to commence a Championship not more than 30 minutes prior to the scheduled commencement time;
 - d. With the exception of the first section of the day, must be in costume and ready to dance not less than

30 minutes prior to the time scheduled for their competition and;

e. Present to the marshalling area when called to do so by Stage Personnel.

NOTE: Sections will only be called for once. It is the dancer's responsibility to be present at the marshalling area to dance in the correct numerical order.

- 13) Make-up (including false eyelashes and tanner on the face) is not permitted for dancers in the 6 & under, 7 Years, 8 Years and 9 Years sections at the 2025 Australian International Oireachtas. Dancers presenting to the marshalling area wearing makeup will be required to remove any makeup before being allowed onto the stage. Leg tan is permitted.
- 14) Should a dancer lose a heel or a complete shoe or have an open lace, they may stand back, allowing the other dancer(s), where applicable, to continue dancing uninhibited. In such a case the dancer concerned will be permitted to re-dance as soon as it is deemed practicable by the stage personnel.
- 16) No liability is accepted by AIDA Inc. for any injury caused to any person, including but not limited to, competitors, however caused and whether or not caused by the negligence or default of AIDA Inc., its servants or agents. The lodgement of an entry will be deemed to be an acceptance of this provision.
- 17) Should a dancer fall, slip or bump into another dancer on stage, whether in solos or in teams, the adjudicator MUST ring the bell thereby stopping the performance of all dancers on stage. Dancers so affected will be permitted to re-dance and will be marked then at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
- 18) Should in the opinion of the Stage Personnel (in consultation with medical personnel if deemed necessary) a dancer be unfit to re-dance, and if such dancer insists on performing the dancer concerned will only be permitted to re-dance on completion of a formal declaration which removes the organising committee of any liability. Any repeat accident/incident which results in that dancer being unable to complete the required number of bars in any round, will result in the dancer withdrawing without question from the championship.

19)

- A. If the adjudicators ring the bell to stop a performance during the last eight (8) bars in Round 1 or 2, the dancers will only be required to dance the last 16 bars of that dance.
- B. If the adjudicators ring the bell to stop a performance during any part of their open solo set dance, the dancer will perform the entire dance for their re-dance.
- C. If the adjudicators ring the bell to stop a performance any sooner than the last eight (8) bars during a RE-DANCE in Round 1 or Round 2, the judges will decide (by majority vote conducted via the organising committee) if a full dance is required or if an exception can be made to require only the last 16 bars of that dance. (CLRG, March 2025)
- 20) A competitor must not walk off the stage during a performance unless instructed to do so by an adjudicator. A dancer who dismisses himself or herself from the stage, without the permission of an adjudicator, will not be marked for that particular dance.
- 21) If at any stage during a performance on stage an adjudicator feels that, due to the health and safety of a performer on stage that the performance should be stopped, the adjudicator must ring the bell.
- 22) Respect for fellow competitors on stage is a requirement at all times. Lack of respect or courtesy for fellow

competitors by aggressive dancing on stage will be subject to penalty at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.

- 23) The starting number for each solo round will be determined prior to the commencement of the Championships and will be printed in the program.
- 24) The heavy and light rounds from 13 years upwards will be danced 2 at a time. (Convention 2025) All other ages will dance 3 at a time, with the exception of the Heavy Round of the 7 & 8 years sections, which will be danced 2 at a time (if there are three dancers remaining at the end of these sections they will dance 3 at a time). (Convention 2025)
- 25) Number checks will take place at regular intervals during the course of each competition. Dancers are required to present to side stage when called by the MC.
- 26) The Organising Committee will provide official musicians for the championships. In the case of the Freestyle Section teachers will need to provide their own pre-recorded music prior to the event **NO LATER THAN 15 JUNE** 2025 for download onto the AIDA Inc. iPod. All recorded music will be played through the official sound system. This can be submitted via music@aidainc.com.
- 26) Decisions of the Organising Committee as to the interpretation of these rules, and in relation to all other matters pertaining to the Australian International Oireachtas, shall be final.

SOLO OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES AND DIRECTIVES

- 1) The required age eligibility and dances for each solo championship are set out in Appendix A.
- 2) In all championships (excepting Championship 1) competitors will dance the heavy dance first. In the case of the 6 Years and Under section the order of dancing will be Light Jig, Single Jig, Reel (2023 AIDA Inc. Convention).
- 3) Adult Mixed Open Championships Eligibility An Irish Dancer aged 18 years or over who no longer wants to compete in the mainstream Ladies/Men sections and hasn't competed in any competition other than an adult section in the previous 5 years.
 - a) An Adult Irish Dancer who has competed in non-adult sections in the previous 5 years due to the lack of availability of adult sections, may apply via their teachers, to their State Branch, for the 5-year stipulation to be waived. These dancers however must not have placed in the top 50% of a non-adult championship section (including online competitions) where the section contained more than 5 competitors. Applications need to be submitted at time of entry.
- 4) Dancers will dance 48 bars in the Reel and Heavy Jig, 40 bars in the Slip Jig and Hornpipe, with the exception of
 - a) the 6 and Under Mixed Championship where dancers will dance 48 bars of a light jig (116), a single jig (124), and a reel (113, 116 or 122)
 - b) the Sub Minor Championships, where competitors will dance 32 bars of the Heavy Jig, 48 bars of the Reel, and a Traditional Set Dance comprising the first step and right foot of the Set.
 - c) the Adult Mixed Championship, where competitors will dance 32 bars of the Heavy Jig or Hornpipe, either 48 bars of the Reel or 40 Bars of the Slip Jig, and a Traditional Set Dance comprising the first step and right foot of the Set.

5) In the 6 & Under Mixed Championship there will be a choice of speed for the reel in either 113, 116 or 122. Those dancers presenting to the marshalling area will need to advise the speed for their reel. Competitors will dance the Light Jig and Single Jig for their first two rounds. The third round for the Reel will be danced in numerical order in groups of the same speed commencing with the speed relevant to the starting number followed by the speed relevant to the next closest number to the starting number and continuing in like manner until all three reel speeds have been danced. (2024 AIDA Inc. Convention)

For example: 101, 102, 104, 106, 109 and 110 are dancing Reel speed 113. 103, 105 and 107 are dancing Reel speed 122. 108 is dancing Reel speed 116.

The stage order would be:

101, 102, 104 Reel speed 113;

103, 105, 107 Reel speed 122.

106, 109, 110 Reel speed 113,

108 Reel speed 116; and so on.

- 6) Dancers aged 6 & under may enter EITHER the 6 and Under Mixed Championship OR the Sub-Minor 7 years and Under sections. They are permitted to enter into a Príomh Comórtas Championships (see Príomh Comórtas entry criteria below).
- 7) In all competitions, competitors must commence their dance in the first two rounds from the designated starting points. In the set dance round a competitor may choose their starting point.

[NOTE] In addition to the 3 start markers on stage for the heavy round an additional 2 markers, in a different colour tape, will be placed between the 3 heavy round markers indicating the start points for the light shoe rounds. (CLRG March 2025)

- 8) When the first two dances in a championship have been completed the official points system will be used to place the competitors in order of merit over the two dances. On this basis, and subject to the minimum competitor requirements, a limited number of competitors will be recalled for the set dance round. A dancer who fails to complete one of the dances of the first two rounds will not appear in the recall round.
- 9) In all competitions only recalled competitors will perform their set dance. In the case where there are 20 or fewer competitors that perform in any section, all dancers will be recalled to perform their set dance. In the 6 & Under Mixed Championship, and the 7 & 8 Years Championships, all competitors will dance their three dances. There will be no recall.
 - a) Due to withdrawals on the day, if 20 or fewer competitors perform in a section they are automatically recalled at the AIO or Nationals. The original prize giving stays the same and the remaining dancers will receive a championship award. (AIDA Convention 2023)
- 10) A set dance list is no longer required and dancers who recall are responsible for advising the MC the name and speed of their set dance, from the 9 years age group and up. All set dances must be from the official list contained in this syllabus and be performed within the specified speeds (Appendix C).
- 11) The onus of ensuring that the stage personnel are informed of the correct metronome speed, and the correct title of the set dance, will rest with the dancer who should advise these details at the time of registration for the recall round.

- 12) In the case of set dances, introductions will be played only once. No variation of the speed of the music will be permitted once dancing is due to commence. Should a dancer submit an incorrect metronomic speed to the stage personnel and commence dancing at that speed, the dancer must continue to dance as no further opportunity of tempo will be allowed.
- 13) Speed for Traditional Set Dances is as per list Appendix A.
- 14) Where the final round of a Championship is a Traditional Set dance that round will be danced in numerical order in groups of same Traditional Set Dance commencing with the Traditional Set Dance relevant to the starting number followed by the Traditional Set Dance relevant to the next closest number to the starting number and continuing on in like manner until all Traditional Sets have been danced. (2024 AIDA Inc. Convention)

For example: 101, 102, 104, 106, 109 and 110 are dancing St. Patrick's Day. 103, 105 and 107 are dancing Blackbird. 108 is dancing Job of Journeywork.

The stage order would be:

101, 102, 104 St. Patrick's Day;103, 105, 107 Blackbird.106, 109, 110 St. Patrick's Day,108 Blackbird; and so on.

15) Any competitor in breach of the CLRG & AIDA Inc. rules will be subject to disqualification.

Artificial carriage aids

16) In order to maintain the health and safety of all dancers, artificial carriage aids are not permitted. All dancers lining up side stage prior to any round at any competition will be required to perform the simple exercise of raising their arms to shoulder level unhindered. If unable to do this by the time of their rotation due to costume stitching or arm attachments, these competitors will not be permitted to perform.

Make-up

17) Make-up (including false eyelashes) is not permitted for dancers, in either solo or team competitions, up to and including the Under 10 age group. For the avoidance of doubt, for the purposes of this rule the term "make-up" includes tinted moisturiser and any artificial tanning products. Tanning of the legs is permitted.

Costumes and shoes

- 18) All forms of dance school identification, be it by sign, shape, colour-piece, logo or symbol are banned from all solo costumes worn by any competitor in any competition.
- 19) For heavy rounds in competitions, dancers may not wear soft shoes that have been altered with the addition of heels and tips in an attempt to turn them into hard shoes. Dancers found to be wearing such altered shoes for heavy rounds may be denied access to that round of the competition.
- 20) Costumes must consist of full front, side and back sections. Cut-away styles, without a full skirt backing, are not acceptable.
- 21) Female Adult dancers are required to wear tights no less than 70 denier.

TRADITIONAL SET DANCE COMPETITION (OR LIGHT SHOE STEP DOWN THE LINE)

- 1) A Traditional Set Dance competition or a Light Shoe step down the line will be offered to those competitors who are not recalled in the Championship Age Groups. This will be determined ahead of the event by the organisers.
- 2) Entries will be taken on the day of the competition.
- 3) Refer to the list of Traditional Set Dances and Speeds as contained in Appendix A.

PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIPS - RULES AND DIRECTIVES

- 1) Preliminary Championships will be offered in the girls sections from 8 Years of age.
- 2) Preliminary Championship will be danced as part of the Open Championship.
- 3) Entry to the Preliminary Championships will be restricted to the following
 - a. Dancers who have never won an Open Championship,
 - b. Dancers who did not attain a top five position at an Australian National Championships in the previous year (ie 2024).
 - c. Dancers who did not win the AIO Preliminary Championship in the previous year (ie. 2024).
- 4) PLEASE NOTE: Preliminary championships results will be calculated on the first two rounds of the Open Championship only, and only for dancers entered into the Preliminary Championship, with Irish points awarded as such.
- 5) Dancers cannot enter the Preliminary Championship unless they have entered the Open Championships in the same age group.
- 6) Dancers entering Championship or Championship/Preliminary Championship combined can also enter one Príomh Comórtas if eligible.

PRÍOMH COMÓRTAISI (PREMIER CHAMPIONSHIPS) - RULES AND DIRECTIVES

- 1) Príomh Comórtas (Premier Championships) events will be offered for Bun, Tus, Mean and Adult dancers and will be adjudicated by one adjudicator drawn from the floor.
- 2) Dancers are only permitted to enter one Príomh Comórtas section.
- 3) Eligibility criteria:
 - a. Bun Príomh Comórtas Eligibility dancers must be eligible to dance in Bun in the dances outlined in the syllabus at the time of entry. (Convention 2025) Dances to be performed will be set. Refer to Appendix B and rule 6 listed below.

NOTE: The Bun Grad section for the 6 yrs and Under will be split into a Bun Grad A and Bun Grad B, with those dancers who enter the 6 yrs and Under Mixed Championship event only eligible to enter Bun Grad B. (Convention 2025)

b. Tus Príomh Comórtas Eligibility— dancers must be eligible to dance in Tus in the dances outlined in the

syllabus at the time of entry. (Convention 2025) Dances to be performed will be set. Refer to Appendix B and rule 6 listed below -

- c. Mean Príomh Comórtas Eligibility dancers 8 years and under must be eligible to dance in Mean in both of the following dances:
 - Reel,
 - Heavy Jig.

Dancers 9 years and over must be eligible to dance in Mean all of the following dances:

- Reel
- Slip Jig
- Heavy Jig
- Hornpipe.

Dances to be performed will be set. Refer to Appendix B and rule 6 listed below.

Dancers must also not have

- Won a State Championship
- Won an Open Championship

(Convention 2025)

- d. Adult Príomh Comórtas Eligibility dancers over the age of 18 years who did not take Irish dance classes as a juvenile.
- 4) Please refer to the below table for the current rules regarding costumes, make-up, tanning and wigs for Príomh Comórtaisí:

Appropriate attire* refers to long/short-sleeved blouses/shirts & skirts/trousers, polo tops & skirts/trousers, body suits & skirts or tunics that conform to the regular costume length rule. Low-cut tops and short tight skirts are not permitted.

- 5) Adult female dancers are required to wear tights no less than 70 denier.
- 6) The dances required are set out in Appendix B. Provided the dancer meets the criteria they can compete in the relevant section even if they have been graded out of the dances listed. Eg: If a dancer has graded out of Bun Reel and Bun Light Jig, but are still Bun Grad for Single Jig or Slip Jig the dancer is still eligible for the Bun Príomh Comórtas.

CONTEMPORARY FREESTYLE DANCE (Competition 42) – RULES AND DIRECTIVES

- 1) There must be a minimum of six (6) dancers and a maximum of twelve (12).
- 2) Music may be in any tempo and the dance can be performed in light or heavy shoes.
- 3) Music must not exceed three (3) minutes in duration. The timing will commence from the start of music playing and finish when the music stops. Additional music will be permitted for walk-offs.
- 4) Only Irish music or music of related ethnic origin in 2/4, 4/4, 6/8 or 9/8 time, or a combination of those times will be permitted. Any change of music must last for at least 16 bars.
- 5) All music must be submitted to AIDA Inc. electronically prior for checking purposes. It is imperative that the person submitting music for the Contemporary Freestyle Section owns all rights to the music or is licensed to use the music for the purposes of a stage performance. This music and permission/rights/licencing must be submitted by Friday 13th June 2025 to music@aidainc.com.
