**Stars of the future** – Aimed at young dancers who may not be 100% ready for a feis. Each dancer can perform 16-24 bars of reel music on stage one at a time. They may be accompanied by a parent or teacher. These dancers are not permitted to compete in Bun Grád competitions or any other adjudicated competition.

- Stars of the future €10.00 (All dancers receive a prize)
- Solo dance €5.00 (Trophy for 1<sup>st</sup>. A Medal for every dancer in all reel competitions).
- Light/Heavy Trophy Dance in Bun & Tus €10.00 (Trophy & Sash for Top 5).
- Meán Priomh €25 (includes 3 results) Trophy & Sash for Top 5.
- Open Championship U6 €25
- Open Championship €40 (includes 3 results.) (U7 upwards)
- Prelim & Open Championship €45 (includes 4 results) (9-10 14-15)
- Ceili Championship: €5.00 per dancer.
- Admission €5.00 payable on the day. <u>CASH ONLY.</u> No Card FACILITIES
- Open Set Dance Competition (9-10 ONLY) NO FEE
   This competition is an open invitation for all 9-10s to perform their open set dance. It's a stand alone competition and separate from the championship.

#### Rialacha

- 1. Age reckoned from January 1st 2025
- 2. Entries will only be accepted from teachers currently registered with An Comisiún le Rincí Gaelacha.
- 3. No refunds except in the case that the event does not run.
- 4. The adjudicator's decision is final.
- 5. Objections must be lodged in writing within one hour of the announcement of a competition & be accompanied by a fee of €30 which will be refunded should the objection be valid.
- 6. The feis committee as far as is practical will provide a stage surface suitable for dancing. However, the committee cannot accept any liability whatsoever for injuries sustained while on stage. The lodgement of any entry will be deemed to be acceptance of this made by the dancer & his/her parent(s) or guardian(s).
- 7. The feis committee reserve the right to refuse feis entries and refuse entrance to the venue.
- 8. The feis committee reserve the right to move competitions/results to a different stage or alternate age groups to ensure the smooth running of the event.

### 9. Photography:

- Any form of unauthorised photography that has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in
  motion, using electronic or manual means e.g. mobile phone, standard camera, video camera, with or
  without flash enhancement, is forbidden during all competitions.
- Awards presentation photos will be put on the organising feis Social Media page. If you do not wish your child to be on this page you must inform the organisers of the feis before the awards are made.
- Videoing of competitions is strictly forbidden.
- 10. In prelim and open competitions up to and including under 10, make up (including false lashes and facetan) is not permitted.
- 11. No block/en point (stationary or moving) permitted for all ages up to and including under 12 with the exception of dancers who will be competing in the 12-13 age group next year (2026), who will be exempt from this rule from 1st September 2025.

### 13. Costumes:

- Length of costumes must adhere to principles of modesty and enable dancers to safely execute their movements and steps.
- Appropriate undergarments covering the midriff must be worn. Undergarments must provide full coverage (as per illustrations on www.clrg.ie).
- Adjudicators who determine a costume to lack modesty or be too short may ask a competitor to change into black tights (of a denier not less than 70%) in order for the dancer to continue in the competition. If the competition is being judged by more than 1 adjudicator, all adjudicators on the panel must agree that dancer be asked to put on tights.
- Changing of costumes is not permitted in halls or public areas. Dancers must use changing rooms provided.
- In order to comply with health and safety measures, all dancers lining up side stage for any round, may be asked to raise their arms to shoulder level unhindered. If unable to do this by the time of their rotation, due to costume stitching/arm attachments, the dancer will not be permitted to perform.
- 14. <u>Stars of the Future:</u> this competition is aimed towards dancers of any age who may not be ready for graded competitions. Dancers must not dance in Bun Grád or any other adjudicated competition at the event.

#### 15. Bungrád and Túsgrád:

- Dancers are not permitted to wear wigs or tan on legs in Bun and Tús Grád.
- Dancers up to and including the under 12 age group are not permitted to wear make up (including false eye lashes and face tanner).
- Dancers may only wear a traditional class costume or long/short sleeve blouse/shirt/t-shirt and skirt/trousers, bodysuit/leotards and skirt (must conform to the regular costume length rule). Low cut

- tops or short tight skirts are not permitted. Appropriate undergarments covering the midriff must be worn.
- Bun Grád competitions are confined to dancers who at the time of entry have never won 1<sup>st</sup> place (or graded out) of that particular dance in any age group or grade. Basic steps only are permitted in Bun Grád.
- Tús Grád competitions are confined to dancers who at the time of entry have never won 1<sup>st</sup> place (or graded out) of that particular dance in any age group in Tus Grád, Mean Grád, Preliminary or Árd Grád grades. Basic steps or their first hard/advanced version of each dance are permitted in Tús Grád. Steps in Tús Grád heavy jigs and hornpipes should be similar to those performed in traditional sets.
- "Grading up" in Bun and Tús Grád:
  - 1-5 dancers = 0 dancers grade up
  - 6-20 dancers = 1 dancer grades up
  - 21 30 dancers = 2 dancers grade up
  - 30 + dancers = 3 dancers grade up
- 16. <u>Mean Grád</u>: Mean Grád competitions are confined to those who at the time of entry have never won 1<sup>st</sup> place (or graded out) of that particular dance in any age group in Mean Grád, Preliminary or Árd Grád grades.
- 17. **Preliminary:** to be eligible to compete in a Preliminary Championship:
- Dancers must not have placed in the top 3 in an Open Championship judged by 3 or more adjudicators.
- Dancers must not have won a Preliminary Championship more than 2 times in the current year, **HOWEVER**, if there are 5 are less in a Preliminary competition the dancer is still eligible to compete in Preliminary Championship.
- Dancers must not have qualified for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne in the current year (2025) or previous year (2024).
- Dancers must not have recalled in the actual Championship at Oireachtas Rince na hÉireann in the current year (2025) or previous year (2024).
- Dancers having won 2 Preliminary Championships may not compete in any Mean grad competition for the remainder of the year **HOWEVER**, if a dancer has won only one Preliminary Championship they may continue to compete in Mean grad (with the exception of the dances that they won the Prelim Championship with).
- Exceptions pertaining to particular regions:
  - Dancers who qualify for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne where there are five dancers or less in the
    competition at their Regional Oireachtas are exempt from this ruling. They may remain in the
    Preliminary Championships if they so wish.
  - Boys who have qualified for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne but were not placed in the top 3 at their Regional Oireachtas and who otherwise fulfil the Prelim Criteria, may continue to compete in Preliminary Championships.
