# **Entry Fees**

Solo Dancing Championship Only	NZ \$60.00 entry fee + \$30.00 championship fee
Team Dancing Championships Only	NZ \$60.00 entry fee + \$10.00 per dancer per team
Solo & Teams Championships	NZ \$60.00 entry fee + \$30.00 championship fee + \$10.00 per dancer per team, with a \$150.00 maximum entry fee per dancer
World Qualifying Teams Only*	NZ \$30.00 entry fee + \$10.00 per dancer per team (excluded from \$150 maximum entry fee)
Ulster Cup	NZ \$30.00 entry fee (excluded from \$150 maximum entry fee)

\* Championship fee (NZ \$30.00 entry fee + \$10.00 per dancer per team) applies if the dancer is only competing in the World Qualifying Teams section. If a dancer has entered in the Team Dancing Championships, a \$10 fee is applied for each additional World Qualifying team dance.

A family discount of 20% will apply to families with three (3) or more dancers on **solo entries only**. *N.B. no refunds will be provided*.

- Solo entries & payment will be accepted until 5pm NZT Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2025.
- Late Solo entries & payment will be accepted until **5pm NZT Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> July 2025** with an additional late fee of NZ \$100.00 per dancer. No changes will be accepted after this date.
- Team entries & payment will be accepted until **5pm NZT Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> July 2025** No late entries will be accepted for teams. No changes will be accepted after this date.
- Once payment has been made, no changes and/or refunds will be given.
- Ulster Cup entries & payment will be accepted until 5pm NZT Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2025. No late entries will be accepted.
- NZ Entries received from teachers or dancers not registered with TIDA OF NZ, Inc. for 2025 will not be accepted.
- International entry is conditional to dancers from countries whose national championships are currently open to NZ dancers.
- All Teachers must hold current registration with An Coimisiún Le Rincí Gaelacha for 2024/2025.
- In both solo dancing and team dancing, competitors' age will be taken from 1 January 2025.
- Where a competitor's birthday falls on 1st January 2025, he/she/they shall be regarded for the TIDA OF NZ Championships as under that age attained on that day.
- Dancers serving a six-month period refraining from competition under the Transfer Rules of An Coimisiún at the time of the Oireachtas are not eligible to compete.

#### TIDA OF NZ Scholarship

The criteria for this award are as follows:

- For dancers in the under 10 age group and above.
- The winner will be awarded \$3,000 to compete at one of the following major championships: Worlds, North American Nationals, All Irelands, All Scotland's, Great Britain's or Australian International Oireachtas.
- It can only be won only by a TIDA OF NZ registered dancer, and that dancer can win the scholarship no more than twice, and not in successive years.
- The International Judges officiating at the NZ Irish Dancing Championships will select the Scholarship winner.
- They are the sole Judges of this Award and must not discuss their decisions with anyone other than each other and the Chairperson or a delegated TIDA OF NZ member on the day of the announcement.
- The award must be taken up in the year following the Award. If the winner does not travel within the year specified, the Award cannot be claimed.
- Dancers must advise the committee prior to the championships if they do not wish to be considered.
- Proof of travel must be provided.

#### **Ulster Cup**

- For Senior Dancers 18 Years & Over on 1<sup>st</sup> January.
- Dancers to dance a Heavy Jig 48 bars.
- The runner-up will receive The Jack Kavanaugh Memorial Cup, and every entrant will receive a participation award.

#### World Championship Qualification

- Qualification places can only be obtained by New Zealand dancers.
- Where an international dancer places ahead of a NZ dancer in a qualifying place, that place will pass to the next NZ dancer placed.
- Qualifications for World Championships are as set out in CLRG Rules.

# **General Solo Dancing Rules**

- In all competitions, competitors must commence their dance in the first two rounds from the designated starting points. In the set dance round a competitor may choose his/her/their starting point.
- All sections to be danced in front of 3 adjudicators.
- All Championship classes are Open Classes.
- The New Zealand Championship to be danced over three dances.
- All place points count towards Championship results.
- All competitors dance all 3 dances. (There will be no recall in any section).
- All sections up to the **Under 10 age group** will dance 3 at a time for the hard shoe round providing the stage size is no less than the Commission recommended size for a Championship.
- Dancers in the Under 7 Mixed Section will dance round 3 (Single Jig), 3 at a time. Dancers in the Under 8 and Under 9 Sections will dance round 3 (the traditional set dance), 2 at a time.
- All solo sections Over 8 years will commence with the Heavy Round. Solo sections Under 8 years will commence with the Light Jig Round.
- All sections will commence at the lowest number and continue numerically in all age groups. The draw for the start of rounds two and three will be printed in the program.
- It is recommended that entrants in all the over 9-year sections perform an Open set dance, however a traditional set dance is permitted in the syllabus timing for that section.
- After each dance, competitors are to return to the pre-registration/marshalling area.
- When competitors register, they are to confirm the name of their Set Dance and the speed.
- If a competitor arrives late and their section is under way, if they have not missed their position in the section and therefore are not out of numerical order they are permitted to dance. If, however, they have missed their position, they are not permitted to dance.
- Length of Dances for New Zealand Championship:
  - Single Jig (Under 7 Mixed) 40 bars
  - Light Jig (Under 7 & Under 8 Mixed) 40 bars
  - Hard Jig (Under 9 Mixed) 32 bars
  - o Hard Jig (Over 9 years) 48 bars
  - o Hornpipe 40 bars
  - $\circ \quad \text{Slip Jig 40 bars}$
  - o Reel 48 bars
- Dancers who begin to dance before or after the stipulated 8 bar introduction in any round will automatically receive a ZERO for that round from all adjudicators.
- Where a dancer fails to complete his/her/their performance in any given round, that dancer is to be given ZERO marks by each adjudicator for that round.

- All age groups starting from Men Under 18 and above will be danced as one age group, labelled Men 17 & Over.
- Qualifiers within combined sections are to be announced based on their qualifying age group.

# **General Team Dancing Rules**

- Should a dancer of a figure dance be unable to take part at the time of the competition, a replacement may be permitted to dance. The teacher is responsible for notifying the Nationals committee. An emergency is defined as an event which happens either within seven days immediately preceding the first day of competition of the Championships or during the Championships. There will be no extra fee for that dance to act as the replacement however, if the replacement dancer selected is not entered into the National Championships, they will be required to cover the base 'Teams Only' fee of NZ \$60.00.
- Schools may combine for Figure Dancing where one school has insufficient numbers to enter a section. In
  composed sections, if one school already has two teams entered in a section then they are not eligible to enter a
  combined team with any other school in that section. Pupils may wear the costume of one school or a
  combination of schools. Teams are to be listed under the names of the schools but combined e.g., Brown/Smith.
- Under-age competitors may dance in a higher age group, if necessary to complete a team, provided they are not entered in their own age group, in that dance. The reverse does not apply e.g., the dancer may dance up in a 9-13 years 6-Hand but not dance in the Under 9 6-Hand as well.
- Commission Book Figures to be danced by TOP COUPLE ONLY.
- In sections where there are two teams on the stage together, the stage must be divided in half by masking tape down the centre, and if the last team in the section is dancing on their own, then they must dance on one half of the stage.
- A TIDA OF NZ member or a representative of each school is permitted to film their respective school's composed dances and 8 hands.

#### **Commission Book Eight Hand**

- In the case of The Three Tunes, teams will perform the dance from the beginning up to and including the Hook and Chain irrespective of the figure drawn.
- In the case of the Sweets of May, teams will perform the dance from the beginning up to and including the seesaw irrespective of the figure drawn.
- In the case of the Gates of Derry, teams will perform the dance from the beginning up to and including the Swing Around of the first repeat irrespective of the figure drawn.
- In the case of Lannigan's Ball, teams will perform the full dance irrespective of the figure drawn.

# **Composed Figure Dancing (Two, Three & Four Composed Dances)**

- All Composed Figure Dancing be limited to **two teams** per school per age group.
- No splits on the floor during open composed dancing.
- Reel or Jig Timing, between 112 and 116 bpm speeds.
- To be composed of Figures and Steps as desired.
- Length is a maximum of 80 Bars (10 phrases of 8 bars), which includes the introductory eight bars.
- No splits on the floor.

#### **Open Composed Figure**

- Please refer to the World Championships syllabus for rules on the Open Composed Figure section.
- Minimum of 8 and maximum of 16 dancers.
- No splits on the floor.

#### **World Qualification Team Sections**

World Qualification sections are offered for teams intending to travel to the Worlds 2026 with a Mixed 4 Hand, a Mixed 8 Hand, and/or a Girls/Ladies 8 Hand. Only sections with entries will be included in the Programme.

# **General Information**

- As per CLRG rules for a World Qualification event competitor numbers will be issued to dancers and teams on the day of their competition.
- Both the TIDA of NZ and 2025 Event Logo are permitted only for use by the organisation executive and the event committee. Logos cannot be used or printed on individual school merchandise.
- Competitors must obey instructions of competition officials and backstage stewards.
- Should a dancer lose a heel or a complete shoe he/she/they may stand back allowing the other dancer(s), were able to continue dancing uninhibited. In such a case the dancer concerned will be permitted to re-dance as soon as it is deemed practicable by the stage steward.
- TIDA OF NZ Inc., will, as far as is practicable, provide a stage surface suitable for dancing.
- However, TIDA OF NZ Inc., and An Coimisiún le Rincí Gaelacha cannot accept any liability for injuries sustained while on stage. Should a dancer fall on stage, the adjudicator must ring the bell to stop the performance of the dancer(s). If able, the dancer affected will be permitted to re-dance.
- If at any given time an adjudicator feels the welfare of a dancer(s) is at risk, they must ring the bell to stop the performance.
- Competitors desiring to enter a protest must lodge the same through their teacher in writing to the Master of Ceremonies, together with \$100.00. If after investigation the protest is deemed frivolous, the deposit may be forfeited. No protest may be entertained unless lodged within two hours of the announcement of the adjudicator's result. In the event of a protest, all available dancing teachers are to be present while the protest is discussed.
