In the case of a non-permanent Australian Resident, the teacher must provide proof of Residency issued by the Australian Department of Immigration and provide copy to the Returning Officer by the official closing date.

GENERAL RULES

The South Australian, Northern Territory and Tasmanian Regional Oireachtas are conducted under the Rules and Regulations of An Coimisiun Le Rinci Gaelacha, Dublin, and the Australian Irish Dancing Association Inc.

The following rules should be read in light of the AIDA Inc. Mission Statement, the objective of which is to encourage good sportsmanship in a healthy, positive, and fair spirited environment. This objective should be upheld by ALL teachers, dancers, parents, and spectators at all events

Failure to comply with the terms and conditions specified in this syllabus may result in non-acceptance on entries or **disqualification.**

<u>RULES</u>

In order for entries to be accepted all competitors:

- 1. must be pupils of teachers who, at the date of entry, have an active membership with An Coimisiun for the year 2023 and who are financial members of AIDA (SA,NT&TAS) Inc. for 2023.
- 2. must be a resident of South Australia, the Northern Territory or Tasmania. An exemption for non-residents may only be granted under the provisions of Rule 3.2 Rules for Dancing Teachers and Adjudicators.
- 3. must be registered as a pupil with AIDA Inc. by the official closing date of entries.
- 4. must not, on the date(s) of their competition(s), be ineligible to compete due to any rule; and
- 5. must have been properly entered with all entry fees paid in full by the official closing date.

Competitors must obey all instructions of the Organising Committee, otherwise permission to dance will be withdrawn.

Lodgement of an entry shall be taken to signify that the Teacher, Parent, and Pupils concerned accept these rules in full and agree to strictly abide by them.

AGE LIMITS

 The age of a competitor shall be taken as on 1st January 2023. Where a competitor's birth date falls on 1st January, he/she shall, for the purpose of the South Australian, Northern Territory and Tasmanian Regional Oireachtas, be regarded as under the age attained on that day.

<u>PRIZES</u>

- 2. Prizes will be awarded in each section as determined by AIDA (SA,NT&TAS) Inc.
- 3. All perpetual trophies must be returned clean from dust and dirt and in good condition by the person who signed for the trophy, or by their representative. The return of trophy is registered with the nominated official or AIDA member at the <u>start</u> of Championship at the designated area for sign in of trophy receipt.
- Responsibility for the loss and/or damage to trophies is to the recipient of the trophy as stated in the agreement signed at the time of presentation in 2022.
 Please note, damage must be repaired prior to return of trophies and trophies must be returned with their cover.

Failure to repair a trophy, therefore returning a trophy in an unsuitable state, will result in a **\$100** fee. It is also the responsibility of the recipient to engrave the trophy with the winner's name and year before return.

ORDER OF DANCING

- **5.** AIDA (SA,NT&TAS) Inc. has the right to commence a Championship at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled commencement time.
- **6.** With the exception of the first section of the day, competitors must be in costume and ready to dance at least 30 minutes prior to the time scheduled for their competition.
- 7. Competitors must present themselves to the marshalling area when called to do so by Stage Personnel. Sections will only be called for ONCE. If a competitor misses this call, or is not in the marshalling area on time, the section may begin without them resulting in disqualification of that competitor.
- 8. Competitors must dance in numerical order as published in the official programme. The starting number for each solo round will be determined by ballot prior to the commencement of the Championships and will be printed in the program.

COMPETITOR CONDUCT AND MISHAPS

- **9.** No liability is accepted by AIDA (SA,NT&TAS) Inc. for any injury caused to any person, including but not limited to, competitors, however caused and whether or not caused by the negligence or default of AIDA (SA,NT&TAS) Inc., its servants, or agents. The lodgement of an entry will be deemed to be an acceptance of this provision.
- **10.** Should a competitor lose a heel or a complete shoe, or have an open lace, he/she may stand back, where applicable, allowing the other competitor(s) to continue dancing uninhibited. In such a case, the competitor concerned will be permitted to re-dance as soon as it is deemed practicable by the stage personnel.
- **11.** With regards to falls, slips and bumps
 - a) Should a dancer fall on stage, whether in solos or in teams, the adjudicator MUST ring the bell to stop the performance of the dancer(s). Dancers so affected will be permitted to re-dance and will be marked then at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
 - If a competitor falls during the last 8 bars of any performance, then he/she will only be required to dance the last 16 bars of that dance.
 - If a dancer falls during the set part of their recall, they will only dance the set part again at a time convenient to both the dancer and the Stage Personnel.
 - b) Should a dancer slip, bump into another dancer or have a costume malfunction whether in solos or in teams, the bell may be rung at the discretion of the adjudicators to stop the performance of the dancer(s). Dancers so affected will be permitted to re-dance and will be marked then at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
 - c) Should, in the opinion of the Stage Personnel (in consultation with medical personnel if deemed necessary), a competitor be unfit to re-dance, and if such competitor insists on performing, then those concerned will only be permitted to re-dance on completion of a formal declaration that removes the organising committee of any liability. Any repeat accident/incident which results in that competitor being unable to complete the required number of bars in any round, will result in the competitor withdrawing without question from the Championship.
- 12. A competitor must not walk off the stage during a performance unless instructed to do so by an adjudicator. A competitor who dismisses themselves from the stage without the permission of an adjudicator will receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators
- **13.** If at any stage during a performance an adjudicator feels that, due to the health and safety of a performer on stage, the performance should be stopped, the adjudicator must ring the bell.
- 14. Respect for fellow competitors on stage is a requirement at all times. Lack of respect or courtesy for fellow competitors by aggressive dancing on stage will be subject to penalty at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
- **15.** No pacers will be used in either team or solo sections.

SOLO CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES AND DIRECTIVES

- 1) The required dances for each competition are set out in Appendix A and B.
- 2) In all Championships, competitors will dance the heavy dance (Heavy Jig or Hornpipe) first, with the exception of the 6 years and under Championship that will commence with the Light Jig.
- 3) The heavy round and light round from 13 years and upwards will be danced 2 at a time. All other ages will dance 3 at a time.
- **4)** In all competitions, competitors must commence their dance in the first two rounds from the designated starting points. In the *Open* Set Dance round a competitor may choose his/her starting point.
- 5) There are no recalls in the Regional Oireachtas and thus all competitors will dance 3 rounds to complete the Championship:
 - a) In the 6 years and under Championships, following an 8-bar introduction, competitors will complete 48 bars in all the following: the Light Jig, Single Jig, and Reel (113).
 - **b)** In the Sub Minor Championships, following an 8-bar introduction, competitors will dance 32 bars of the Jig, 48 bars in the Reel and own choice Traditional Set Dance comprising full step (short) and half of the Set (long).
 - c) In the 9 years and upwards Championships, following an 8-bar introduction, competitors will dance 48 bars in the Heavy Jig and Reel, 40 bars in the Hornpipe and Slip Jig and own choice Set Dance comprising full step (short) and half of the Set (long).
- 6) In all competitions in heavy dances (ie, the Jig and Hornpipe) the lead round must be danced on both the right and left foot.
- 7) Competitors beginning to dance before or after the stipulated 8-bar introduction will automatically receive a **ZERO mark and ZERO points** for that round from all adjudicators.
- 8) With regards to the own choice set dances:
 - a) All competitors from the 9 years and upwards are responsible for advising the Stage Personnel the name and correct metronome speed of their Set Dance. The onus of ensuring that the stage personnel are informed will rest with the competitor who should advise these details at the time of registration.
 - **b)** An incorrect metronomic speed submitted for an open set dance cannot be changed once the musicians have commenced playing the music.
 - c) Introductions to open set dances will be played only once.
 - d) Should a competitor submit an incorrect metronomic speed to the stage personnel and commence dancing at that speed, then the competitor must continue to dance at this speed as no further opportunity of tempo change will be afforded.
 - e) Competitors beginning to dance before or after the stipulated set dance introduction will automatically receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators for that round.
 - f) All Set Dances must be from the official list contained in Appendix B and be performed within the specified speeds. The speeds for Traditional Set Dance are as per Appendix B.
- 9) Additional ZERO point rules:
 - a) If a competitor fails to complete the Double Jig or Hornpipe round of a championship, they will receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators for that round. As a courtesy, they will be allowed to dance the equivalent light shoe round and whilst they will receive marks from each adjudicator they will automatically receive ZERO points and will not be allowed to progress further in the Solo Championship.
 - b) If a competitor fails to complete the Reel or Slip Jig round of a championship, they will receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators for that round. As a courtesy, they will be allowed to dance their final round but will not appear in a medal winning position.
 - c) A competitor who fails to complete the open set dance round will receive ZERO marks and ZERO points from all adjudicators for that round and cannot appear in a medal winning position.
 - d) The definition of complete means that all bars as outlined in the syllabus are danced without any stops (choreographed pauses in steps, however, are permitted).
- **10)** The Organising Committee will provide music for the Championships.
- **11)** To receive prizes or awards, competitors must be in full dancing costume including shoes.
- 12) The costume rules for the Championship follow Section 5: Costume Rules from the official Rules of An Coimisiún le Rincí Gaelacha and the AIDA Inc Grade Rules Addendum A: Make-up and Costume rules. These include, but are not limited to:
 - a) Costumes must consist of full front, side and back sections, along with short/long sleeves. Cut-away styles, without a full skirt backing, are not acceptable.

- **b)** Costume dress necklines must be of collar-bone level or above. This does not preclude the use of alternative fabrics e.g., Lace as an insert. Where lace or chiffon is used as sleeves, the sleeves must start at the shoulder line and end at the cuff.
- c) Length of costume must adhere to principles of modesty and enable dancers to safely execute their movements and steps. Adjudicators who determine a costume to be too short or to lack modestly may ask a competitor to wear black tights (of a denier not less than 70 percent) in order to continue in the competition. For competitions adjudicated by a panel of more than one adjudicator, all adjudicators on the panel must agree to asking the dancer to wear tights.
- d) Appropriate undergarments overing the midriff must be worn. Undergarments must provide full coverage as per the illustration attached. Dancers wearing undergarments that do not cover the areas of the body as in the illustrated example will be asked to put on black tights of a denier of not less than 70%. This is monitored by the adjudicator. For competitions adjudicated by a panel of more than one adjudicator all adjudicator on the panel must agree to ask the dancer to put on tights.
- e) All forms of dance school identification, be it by sign, shape, colour-piece, logo or symbol are banned from all solo costumes worn by any competitor in any competition.
- f) Artificial Carriage Aids In order to comply with health and safety measures, all competitors lining-up side stage prior to any round at any competition will be required to perform the simple exercise of raising their arms to shoulder level unhindered. If unable to do this by the time of their rotation due to costume stitching or arm attachments, these competitors will not be permitted to perform.
- g) Competitors of age 9 years and under are not permitted to wear Make-up (including false eyelashes and / or tanner on the face). However, they are permitted tanning products on legs (as per AIDA Inc 2020 convention).
- **h)** Adult dancers in adult sections, Solo, team or black out outfits are permitted. Adult female dancers are required to wear tights at a minimum of 70 denier.
- **13)** Any competitor in breach of the CLRG & AIDA Inc. rules will be subject to disqualification.
- **14)** Decisions of the Organising Committee, as to the interpretation of these rules and in relation to all other matters pertaining to the South Australian, Northern Territory and Tasmanian Regional Oireachtas, shall be final.

SESSIONAL TRADITIONAL SET DANCE CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES AND DIRECTIVES

- 1) Dancers can compete in a single traditional set dance competition related to the session their solo competition falls under.
- 2) The required dances for each competition are set out in Appendix B.
- 3) The competition will follow the Solo Championships rules and directives unless contrary to below.
- 4) All versions of traditional set dances are acceptable if they are danced in a traditional style.
- 5) Certain movements must be maintained in a traditional style
 - a) Clicks are not permitted in any traditional set dance.
 - **b)** Dancers are not permitted to move in a counter direction when executing "rolls." "Rolls" may be danced on the spot or moving in the direction of the leading foot.
 - c) "Rocks" in any traditional set dance must be fully completed and not cut short.
 - d) Single and double trebles are acceptable in the step (lead) of all traditional set dances.
- 6) In relation to
 - a) JOB OF JOURNEYWORK: "Boxes" may be executed in either FOUR or FIVE beats. The "box" must be completed by the two shoes touching at the toe piece. There is no "stamp" immediately following the "box".
 - **b)** ST. PATRICKS DAY: In the 5th bar of the step (lead) and also the 5th and 10th bars of the set, dancers must hit their toe to their heel. Banging of the toe on the floor is not permitted.

CEILI DANCING CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES AND DIRECTIVES

The required dances for each competition are set out in Appendix C

- 1) These rules and directives must be read in conjunction with the general rules and other relevant sections of this syllabus and those contained in the World Syllabus 2023.
- 2) The number of teams to be entered in each Championship must be submitted by the official closing date of entries.
- 3) The full name and date of birth of each team member must be furnished by official closing date of entries. Any subsequent changes must be notified to the Organising Committee prior to 4th of August 2023.
- 4) All Ceili teams entered as Teams A B C etc. must dance in the position in which they are balloted, and the composition of the whole team cannot be changed after the entry has been submitted.
- 5) A dancer must not be a member of more than one team in the same competition except in the case of an unforeseen emergency and then only with the consent of the Organising Committee.
 - a) An emergency is defined as an event which happens either within 7 days immediately preceding the first day of competition of the South Australian, Northern Territory and Tasmanian Regional Oireachtas or during the course of the Championships. A formal application must be made in writing to an Executive member of the Organising Committee and medical emergencies must be accompanied by a medical certificate. In the event of an unforeseen emergency, the acceptance of the written application will be determined by the Organising Committee.
- 6) The borrowing of dancers for any Feiseanna in Australia is not allowed.
- 7) In case of an emergency, Choreography age restrictions may be waived to allow a younger dancer to be utilized from within the same school on the proviso that the dancer has not competed in choreography in the same age.
- 8) If a team presents to marshalling and is not the team as listed on the entries; where no official notification of change has been received by the Organising Committee, the team will dance but will not appear in the official result.
- 9) Apart from the variations described below, dances must be performed in accordance with the latest edition of *Ar Rinci Ceili*, unless otherwise indicated in the directive on Ceili dances published by An Coimisiun. Movements and figures must be performed in the order specified and the dancers must move in the manner stipulated. Where neither *Ar Rinci Ceili* nor the directive specifies how a particular movement should be performed, the teacher may use his/her discretion with regard to interpretations. Unnecessary embellishments must be avoided.
- **10)** Movements in Ceili dances are intended to flow naturally. Although the numbers of bars may be specified in *Ár Rince Céilí*, the natural flow and rhythm of the dance takes precedence over strict compliance with the written breakdown of bars.
- **11)** In the case of mixed teams, the mixed component must dance the figure.
- 12) For the South Australian, Northern Territory and Tasmanian Regional Oireachtas, Part A and Part B of the stipulated dances in Appendix C will be the choice of each team except for under 10s who will always perform Part A.
- **13)** A team in a competition for Ceili or figure dancing may include dancers who are under the age limit stipulated for the competition subject to the following conditions:
 - a) A teacher may include a number of dancers not exceeding 50% of a Ceili team or 50% of a figure team without seeking prior permission, but must inform the Organising Committee in writing prior to the competition and furnish the names of the underage dancers.
 - **b)** Where the number of under aged dancers allowed dance in the higher age group exceeds 50% in Ceili or 50% in figure, only 50% in Ceili or 50% in figure may also compete in teams in the lower age group.
 - c) The members of a team must be the pupils of the same school.
 - d) Up to 50% of a girls' team competing in a girls' Ceili Championship may also dance across in a competition for mixed teams, subject to all other Ceili Rules
- 14) Maximum number of Ceili Championships in which a dancer can take part is five (5) whether in one or more age groups.
- **15)** Directives of An Coimisiun for Ceili dancing will apply. Refer to the 2023 World Syllabus.

OWN CHOREOGRAPHY CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES AND DIRECTIVES

Own Choreography Under 12 Years Three Hand or 12-14 Years Three Hand:

- 1) Relevant rules of the Championship should be read for the benefit of the adjudicators prior to commencement
- 2) Dance must comprise of a maximum of 96 bars (not including the introduction) of reel music.
- 3) No story is allowed, either read or sung.
- 4) Inappropriate, offensive, provocative, violent or explicit sexual content must not be included.
- 5) The dance must be performed in soft shoes and in team costume.
- 6) Teachers are permitted to use pre-recorded accompaniment for Choreography Sections. Where a team opts to use pre-recorded accompaniment, the teacher must comply with all rules pertaining to same (see below).
- 7) Each team member should dance continuously for the duration of the dance,
 - a) However, pauses found in Ceili Dancing is permitted
 - **b)** Walking steps are permitted if desired.
- 8) The throwing of a dancer or any form of acrobatics including, but not limited to somersaults, backward and forward rolls, handstands etc. are strictly prohibited.
- 9) A Dancer can only compete once per choreography style and cannot dance in both a girls' and a mixed team.
- 10) Dancers cannot dance outside of their age groups. The age limits...
 - a) For the Under 12 Years competition is no minimum age with a maximum age of 11 years.
 - b) For the 12-14 years competition is a minimum age of 12 years and the maximum age is 14 years.
- 11) The names of all team members must be submitted by the official closing date of entries. Any subsequent changes must be notified to the Organising Committee prior to 4th of August 2023.

Own Choreography 12-14 Years Reels in Couples or 15 Years and Over Reels in Couples:

- 1) Relevant rules of the Championship should be read for the benefit of the adjudicators prior to commencement
- 2) Dance must comprise a maximum 72 bars (not including introduction) of reel music.
- 3) No story is allowed, either read or sung.
- 4) Inappropriate, offensive, provocative, violent or explicit sexual content must not be included.
- 5) The dance must be performed in soft shoes and in team costume.
- 6) Teachers are permitted to use pre-recorded accompaniment for Choreography Sections. Where a team opts to use prerecorded accompaniment, the teacher must comply with all rules pertaining to same (see below).
- 7) Each team member should dance continuously for the duration of the dance,
 - a) However, pauses found in Ceili Dancing is permitted
 - **b)** Walking steps are permitted if desired.
- 8) The throwing of a dancer or any form of acrobatics including, but not limited to somersaults, backward and forward rolls, handstands etc. are strictly prohibited.
- 9) A Dancer can only compete once per choreography style and cannot dance in both a girls' and a mixed team.
- 10) Dancers cannot dance outside of their age groups. The age limits...
 - a) For 12-14 years competition is a minimum age of 12 years and the maximum age is 14 years.
 - **b)** For the 15 years and Over is a minimum age of 15 years with no maximum age.
- 11) The names of all team members must be submitted by the official closing date of entries. Any subsequent changes must be notified to the Organising Committee prior to 4th of August 2023.

Own Choreography Senior Four Hand (15 years and Over):

- 1) Relevant rules of the Championship should be read for the benefit of the adjudicators prior to commencement
- 2) Dance must not exceed 96 bars of music, not including introduction.
- **3)** Dance must be in 6/8 timing jig.
- 4) No story is allowed, either read or sung.
- 5) Inappropriate, offensive, provocative, violent or explicit sexual content must not be included.
- 6) The dance must be performed in soft shoes and in team costume.
- 7) Teachers are permitted to use pre-recorded accompaniment for Choreography Sections. Where a team opts to use prerecorded accompaniment, the teacher must comply with all rules pertaining to same (see below).
- 8) Each team member should dance continuously for the duration of the dance,
 - a) However, pauses found in Ceili Dancing is permitted
 - b) Walking steps are permitted if desired.
- 9) The throwing of a dancer or any form of acrobatics including, but not limited to somersaults, backward and forward rolls, handstands etc. are strictly prohibited.
- **10)** A Dancer can only compete once per choreography style and cannot dance in both a girls' and a mixed team.
- **11)** Dancers cannot dance outside of their age groups. The minimum age is 15 years.
- 12) The names of all team members must be submitted by the official closing date of entries. Any subsequent changes must be notified to the Organising Committee prior to 4th of August 2023.

FIGURE DANCING CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1) Relevant rules of the Championship should be read for the benefit of the adjudicators prior to commencement
- 2) These rules and directions must be read in conjunction with the general rules and other relevant sections of this syllabus and those contained in the World Syllabus 2023.
- **3)** Every dance must be capable of being performed on a stage not greater than 30' x 30' i.e. 9.14m X 9.14m.
- 4) Each team must consist of no fewer than eight (8) dancers and not more than sixteen (16) dancers.
- 5) The dance must be performed in team costume.
- 6) Each dance must portray by movements an Irish theme or item.
- 7) Basic steps found in *Ar Rince Ceili* are strongly recommended. Solo dancing steps are not permitted in a Figure Dance.
- 8) Each team member must be on stage from the commencement of the dance and shall dance continuously for the duration of the dance except where, to emphasise a figure, short pauses for up to 4 bars may be permitted.
- 9) Where an entire team pauses to emphasise a figure etc. the pause must not exceed four bars of music. Pauses for longer than 4 bars by some team members are allowed (as in Ceili dancing) if other team members continue to dance.
- 10) Teachers are required to submit an account of their dance via email together with their music no later than 4th of August 2023.to the nominated person. This account must not exceed 200 words.
- **11)** Where a team opts to use pre-recorded accompaniment, the teacher must comply with all rules pertaining to same.
- 12) A dance must not exceed 4 minutes duration from the beginning to end of the dance. Each dance will be timed electronically on receipt of music and the timing will commence from the start of the music playing and finish when the music stops. Music that exceeds four minutes will be returned to the teacher for amendment and must be resubmitted within the week. Additional music will be permitted for walk offs. Any team who is using music which has not been checked will not be able to compete.
- 13) Only Irish music or music of related ethnic origin in 2/4, 4/4, 6/8 or 9/8 time, or a combination of those times will be permitted. Any change of music must be for at least 16 bars.
- 14) The arrangements for musical accompaniment are set out below.
- 15) There is no restriction on hand movements and hand claps are permitted.
- **16)** Elements to be considered in a team's performance include:
 - a) Portrayal of story through Dance
 - b) Figure Content
 - c) Footwork and execution
 - d) Teamwork and Presentation.
- 17) Directives from An Coimisiun as contained in the World Syllabus 2023 will apply.
- 18) Stance and body movement must be performed with modesty in mind
- **19)** The throwing of a dancer or any form of acrobatics including, but not limited to somersaults, backward and forward rolls, handstands etc. are strictly prohibited.
- 20) The story will be read prior to each team's performance and no music will be permitted while the story is being read.
- 21) The members of a team must be members of the same dancing school.
- 22) The names of all team members must be submitted by the official closing date of entries. Any subsequent changes must be notified to the Organising Committee prior to 4th of August 2023.

CHOREOGRAPHY AND FIGURE DANCING CHAMPIONSHIPS OWNERSHIP OF MUSIC

Teachers are permitted to use pre-recorded accompaniment for Choreography Sections. Where a team opts to use pre-recorded accompaniment, the teacher must comply with all rules pertaining to same (see below).

- 1) All pre-recorded music must be submitted electronically, via email in .mp3. All recordings MUST be received no later than 4th of August 2023.
- 2) It is imperative that the person submitting music for use as accompaniment for a Choreography or Figure Dance either, owns all rights to the music, or has been licensed to use the music for the purpose of a stage performance. Teachers must submit the source of their music with their recording. Where a commercially produced work is included in such music, written evidence of appropriate licensing and /or permission from the musician must also be provided.
- 3) Only Irish music or music of related ethnic origin in the relevant timing for each Own Choreography or Figure section (2/4, 4/4 for Reels, 6/8 for Jigs, or a combination of 2/4, 4/4, or 6/8 time for Figure Dances) will be permitted.
- 4) Music must be instrumental in nature and must not contain voiced tracks where lyrics/words are discernible. Music submissions with ambient voice-like tracks with no words may be permitted. All music submitted will be checked by a designated member of the Organising Committee.
- 5) Timely submission of music tracks is essential to ensure all music is checked to ensure it meets all criteria outlined in this syllabus. Teachers submitting music that does not meet these criteria will be notified.

AIDA (SA,NT&TAS) INC. PHOTOGRAPHY POLICY

For the 2023 South Australian, Northern Territory and Tasmanian Regional Oireachtas, AIDA (SA,NT&TAS) Inc. may appoint an official photographer who will take photographs of competitors and presentations.
