# **Competition Rules:**

- 1. Competition must be pupils of teachers registered with An Coimisiun le Rinci Gaelacha, Dublin and be registered to compete with an appropriate regional authority for 2023.
- 2. Entries must be submitted on the official form, stating the competitor's registration number, accompanied by the correct fee and signed by the registered teacher.

- 3. Sections will run at the discretion of the organiser.
- 4. Solo competitors may enter a maximum of TWO premierships, ensuring grading rules are not preached.
- 5. All dancers must report to the marshalling area when called, or risk disqualification
- 6. All competitors must be ready to commence their section at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled starting time. The feis organising committee has the right to commence sections up to 30 minutes prior to the scheduled starting time.
- 7. The committee of the Oxenham Irish Dance Studio reserves the right to amend the order of dances/dancers at any time.
- 8. Competitors will be required to dance to the music provided by the committee of the Oxenham Irish Dance Studio. Teachers are to ensure that speeds are checked at the times allocated.
- 9. A dancer will be permitted to re dance under the following conditions:
  - Any problem with the music (either recorded or live).
  - Loss of a heel or complete show provided they stand back and allow the other dancer to continue dancing.
  - Should a dancer bump, slip or fall, they may re dance at the adjudicator's discretion.
- 10.In all competitions for Primary level upwards, all heavy dances (i.e. Jig & Hornpipe) the lead round must by danced on both the right and left foot.
- 11. Competitors enter the competition at their own risk, regarding injury
- 12. The adjudicators decision is final, any protests must be submitted in writing the feis committee of the Oxenhan Irish Dance Studio and accompanied by a fee of \$50. They will be forfeited if the objection is overruled.
- 13.To receive prizes and awards competitors must be in full dancing costume including dancing shoes.
- 14.Any form of unauthorised photography which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means, e.g., mobile phone, standard camera, video camcorder, cine recorder, commercial film, with or without flash enhancement, is expressly forbidden in competition. This rule does not apply to the filming of Dance to the music, Novice, Beginners, and Own Choice set dances from the designated filming area.

- 15.Social media conditions for AIDA QLD event. As a condition of entry, Parents and Guardians give their consent for their child to be included in photos of the event which may then be used on official AIDA QLD social media accounts. This includes being featured in any media taken (photography or video) in authorised situation by the feis committee including, but not limited to, novice and beginner event, videos and photos taken during presentations for events. If a parent or guardians is not comfortable with their child potentially being featured in any media that may get posted online, it is their responsibility to notify the feis committee via a member of the association prior to the commencement of the event.
- 16.Costume and Make-up mut comply with the current guidelines adopted by AIDA Inc. and CLRG. Beginner and Primary level – dancers 11 years and under are required to wear a traditional class costume or appropriate attire, they may not wear tan, make-up or wigs. Dancers 12 years and over do not have these restrictions. dancers in the 7 and 8 years Intermediate and Open sections will not be able to wear make-up including false eyelashes but will permitted to wear leg tan.
- 17.Adjudicator who determines a costume to be too short or lack modesty, may ask competitor to change in to black tights (of a denier no less than 70) in order for the dancers to continue in the competition.
- 18.Female adult dancers are required to wear tights (of a denier no less that 70)
- 19.In accordance with our obligation under the Protection policy, dancers are reminded to always wear appropriate clothing whilst at the feis (especially in the auditorium area). This means that shorts/skirt must be always worn over leotard and bloomers.
- 20. The use of artificial arm or carriage aids are not permitted.
- 21.No block, en point, stationary or moving, will be allowed to be performed for all ages, up to and including 11 years and under age groups.
- 22.Respect for fellow competitors on stage is a requirement at all times. Lack of respect or courtesy for fellow competitors by aggressive dancing on stage will be subject to a penalty at the discretion of each individual adjudicator.
- 23.Lodgement of an entry form shall be taken to signify that the teacher, pupil and parents concerned accept and agree to strictly abide by all of the above rules.

ONE light shoe dance:

- Reel, Light Jig, Single Jig or Slip Jig

TWO heavy shoe dances:

- Treble Jig or Hornpipe AND Traditional set dance

#### Intermediate premiership: THREE ROUNDS

ONE light shoe dance:

- Reel or Slip Jig

TWO heavy shoe dances:

- Treble Jig or Hornpipe (32 bars only) AND traditional set dance
